Our students have great opportunities to discover and develop whatever their interests and talents may be. The enrichment programme here at Great Sankey High School is wide and covers all areas of the curriculum and beyond, we have a myriad of activities and clubs from Dungeons and Dragons to Coding Club and an array of sport, music, performing arts and academic work shops.

Every child has a supported opportunity to experience the Duke Of Edinburgh Bronze in Year 9 as well as a range of residential experiences and trips abroad.

Facilities across the all subject areas give students an environment in which they can thrive. The school is to shortly open brand new learning spaces and facilities on the recently expanded school site, a £2.5 million science block, £1.6 million sports hall and a £500,000 catering block will ensure that the school continues to meet the needs of our students.

We are very proud of the achievements of our students both in and outside of school, and regularly celebrate and share their success with the wider school community.

Relationships and Support

It is therefore vital that an effective partnership between school and parents is maintained to ensure all students' success. Research has shown that parental involvement in their child's education can impact on their achievement by at least one grade. To support this partnership there are regular parent evenings, termly reports and parent voice sessions.

Excellent Relationships between staff and students are the foundation of our supportive school community. Ofsted highlighted this as a strength of the school.

To support students, we have a dedicated team of pastoral staff who work closely with each student as they progress through the school. Each child has a dedicated form tutor and head of house who are always available should the need arise. Where appropriate we have further staff dedicated to supporting students with more complex needs.

Our student council and school leadership body represent their fellow students and are a driver of school improvement. Students are supportive of each other and an ethos of mutual collaboration and respect runs throughout the school community.

Community

Great Sankey High School is at the heart of the local community, and the school prides itself on having a friendly, welcoming atmosphere.
