Each individual race will have trophies/awards presented to the first 3 finishers overall, and to the first 3 in each class.

In Europe, if the race also forms part of a UK Championship or Lurani Trophy event, the Jubilee awards will be presented in addition to the regular trophies, and will not affect the UK Championship or Lurani Trophy standings.

According to FIA rules, no points table will be produced or published.

After each of the Tour parts, there will be a Special Trophy presented to the driver who is viewed to have performed the best, regardless of class, in that sector.

At the end of the Jubilee, The Howden Ganley Trophy will be presented to the driver who is viewed to have produced the best performance across the whole Tour.

The Classes will be;

South Africa / Australia / North America:

- Front (Classes A & B)
- Drum braked (Classes C & D)
- Disc braked (Class E)

New Zealand:

- Class A (1958-60 Front engine FIAT or Lancia)
- Class B (1958-60 Front engine up to 1100cc BMC Ford Panhard or DKW)
- Classes C & D (1958 – 1963 Rear engine up to 1100cc drum brakes)
- Class E (1961-63 Rear engine disc brakes)

Europe:

- Class A (1958-60 Front engine FIAT or Lancia)
- Class B (1958-60 Front engine up to 1100cc BMC Ford Panhard or DKW)
- Class C (1958-60 Rear engine up to 1100cc drum brakes)
- Class D (1961-63 Rear engine up to 1100cc drum brakes)
- Class E (1961-63 Rear engine disc brakes)
