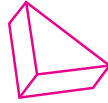

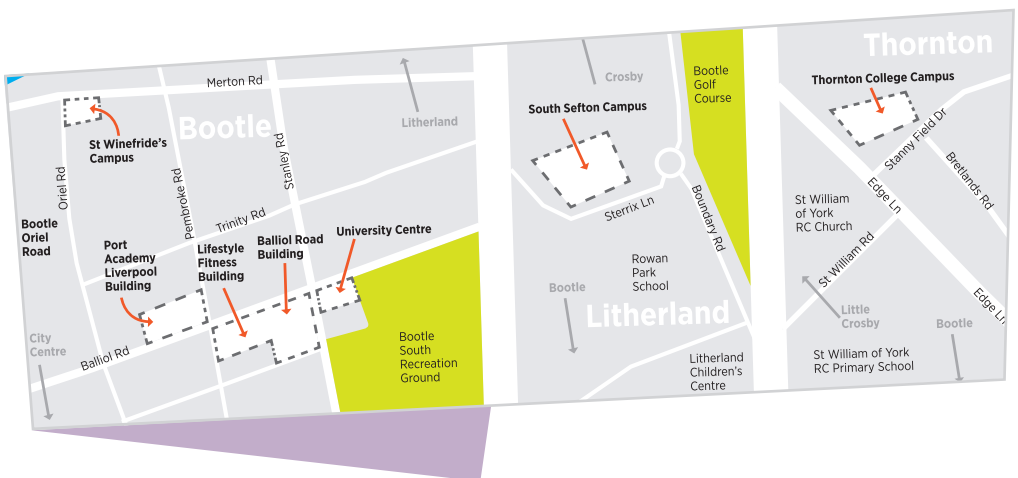
Expect state-of-the-art learning spaces and outstanding support alongside exceptional teaching and unique industry connections, as part of every course at Hugh Baird College.

TALKS AND PRESENTATIONS

★ GATSBY BENCHMARK 1 & 3

Hugh Baird College has a huge amount to offer pupils who are coming close to the end of their time at high school or college/sixth form. Not every group of pupils have the same interests or aspirations, so we will tailor our talks or presentations to suit any audience and any age.

YEARS 7 TO 9

★ GATSBY BENCHMARK 1 & 3

We don't expect many pupils to have made final decisions about their future in years 7 to 9. However, this does not mean they would not benefit from a greater understanding of what awaits them when they finish school and the opportunities available to them.

Learning about vocational education, apprenticeships, A-levels and even being introduced to the idea of Higher Education can be extremely beneficial to lower school pupils as they form ideas about how they might want to progress when they finish school.

Hugh Baird College staff are available to talk to year groups or smaller groups about the choices they might expect to enjoy in the coming years. This can support choosing options during year 9 or can act as a reference point for career guidance for pupils in years 7 and 8.

YEAR 10

★ GATSBY BENCHMARK 1 & 4

Year 10 pupils have a lot on their plate as they get to grips with their GCSE subjects as well as starting to consider their options after year 11. Our tailored presentations and workshops with year 10 pupils are specially designed to help pupils to start looking into their post-16 options and consider which choices may suit them best.

We will present to whole year groups or smaller groups and we can also deliver structured workshop sessions with groups of year 10 pupils. The presentations and workshop sessions will focus on where pupils can learn about the options open to them as well as introducing them to online tools which can help them link their aspirations with a course, apprenticeship or other study programmes.

ACCESS TO A-LEVELS PROGRAMME

NEW!

This programme is designed for those who want to study A-levels but have narrowly missed out on the entry requirements. This programme will allow students to choose 4 of the GCSE courses on offer, with a view to progressing onto an A-level programme after 1 year.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English Language and Maths.
- You must be 16 years old

Please note: Students who have not achieved a grade 4 in English Language and/or Maths must re-sit these subjects.

WHERE TO NEXT?

It is anticipated that those who successfully complete this programme will progress on to a two year A-level study programme.
