

SEFF's South Down Gateway Service

SEFF continues to offer a diverse programme of support within the South Down area through its' Gateway service delivered from Rathfriland. Victims and survivors have access to advocacy, complementary therapies and health and wellbeing casework support services with personnel able to see you within the Rathfriland office. And just recently we have recruited a Counsellor (Anna Waterworth) who is available NOW to deliver the service from the Rathfriland office. Meanwhile we are in the midst of recruiting a Welfare/Benefits Advisor who will be facilitating the needs of local people.

Our last monthly meeting saw our Advocacy Service provide a presentation on the role and remit of the service (Pete Murtagh and Alan Lewis facilitated the session)

Monday 21st October 2019 (PSNI's Legacy Investigations Branch with its' two senior personnel - D/Superintendent Wright and D/Chief Superintendent Singleton) This is the current body/section investigating 'Troubles related' murders/ deaths.

Wednesday 6th November 2019 (Act of Remembrance Service) A minibus will be run from Lisnaskea, Fermanagh (those interested in going should contact the SEFF office. Bus will leave at 5.30pm)

Complementary Therapies starting Friday 4th October 2019 and running for 5 consecutive weekly sessions (10am, 11am, 12pm, 2pm, 3pm, 4.30pm and 5.30pm Appts) Cost - £25 contribution for the full 5 sessions. A second set of therapies will also run post Christmas so if interested in availing please phone the office on 028677 23884.

Cookery classes starting Saturday 5th October 2019 (10.30am - 12.30pm) and will run for **4 weekly sessions- please** note change from 6 week course. Cost £15 for the full course. Please contact SEFF offices on 028 677 23884 if interested in any of these services/activities.

Please do come along from 10.30am for tea, coffee & refreshments and to learn some useful tips. Details of further coffee mornings will appear in the next newsletter.

In the coming months we will also begin work on the development of a Castlederg Border Trail, working in partnership with the UDR Association and other interested local people. Contact the main SEFF or West Tyrone Gateway office for further information.

SEFF's South Armagh Gateway Service

Our formal launch of the Outreach service will take place on Friday 8th November 2019 from 8pm onwards (fittingly tied to Remembrance) We would encourage members from the local area, your families and friends and the wider SEFF membership to attend this important event.

SEFF will be running a bus from Lisnaskea onto the launch event with pick-ups available along the way. The bus will leave SEFF Offices @ 6pm sharp.

Date for diary: SEFF's Annual Act of Remembrance 2019



SEFF's Annual Act of Remembrance will take place this year on Monday 11th November 2019 at 10.45am at SEFF's Memorial in the grounds of Holy Trinity, Church of Ireland, Lisnaskea. Refreshments will follow in SEFF offices afterwards and we will also hear from two innocent victims/survivors of terrorism who will share their experiences.

Further detail around SEFF's Remembrance events will follow in next month's newsletter.

Parliament MUST redress definition of victim

Kenny Donaldson, Spokesman for Innocent Victims United stated: "Recent events in Parliament are a further illustration of the pantomime politics that we have entered into, like many others I have had to pinch myself at times to confirm that what in fact is happening, is actually real".

"The truth is that the UK Government has done everything in its' power to evade doing what is right by innocents within our Society, whether that be historical abuse victims or innocents of the terrorist campaign. The UK Government has shown for 25 years its' willingness to placate terrorism and its' political annexes and it has adopted an arrogant, aloof attitude to the innocents whose lives were forever changed. Essentially the Government has made a calculated call that whatever hurt is reaped upon innocent victims/ survivors of terrorism that they will not respond with violence or the threat of violence -therefore their needs aren't taken seriously".

"We demand of the UK Government a commitment that it will make proper time for the definition of victim to be discussed at the earliest opportunity, and that it will commit to the development of a definition which ends the policy of equating perpetrator with innocent".

"It is within Parliament's powers to right the wrong it preside over in 2006 - it's Westminster that must deal conclusively with this matter through developing a UK-wide definition of victim of terrorism, passing the buck to a Stormont Assembly that doesn't exist and which would never progress this issue because almost half of its' make up are the political wing of the Provisional IRA is not a sustainable or acceptable position to take," concluded Mr Donaldson.

Decision to grant extension to The Victims Commissioner's Contract is NIO cowardice

Kenny Donaldson, Spokesman for Innocent Victims United stated: "The recent announcement by the NIO is sadly a further illustration of the contempt with which innocent victims/survivors of terrorism are held. The NIO are out of touch with the largest constituency of victims/survivors, this was evident over the period of the Legacy Consultation process and today's cowardly announcement is but a continuance of that policy".

"27 victims groups openly and publicly stated their lack of confidence and trust in the leadership offered by the existing Victims Commissioner, the three main unionist political parties were clear that the Commissioner needed to cease her period in office and others were public in their opposition to her continuance in the role".

"For five weeks we have sought a meeting with the Secretary of State or appointed senior officials to discuss our grave concerns following the publications of the Commissioner's advice on Pensions for the seriously injured, a two line baseless email was what we were treated to, meanwhile the Commissioner has offered no acknowledgement of the dire situation her Office holds with the largest swathe of victim/survivor sector opinion".

"In making this announcement today the NIO have declared that they couldn't care less that the Commissioner is not fulfilling the very remit to which she was appointed under statute to fulfil - the Commissioner does not hold the confidence and trust of large swathes of those she is supposedly in place to advocate on behalf and she refuses to represent the case for policy change on a range of victim/survivor related issues".

"Given that the NIO have refused to meet with us we ask publicly; was the request for extension for a further term of four years or the 12 month extension that has been granted? The NIO is increasingly becoming a damaged brand and the new Secretary of State for Northern Ireland Julian Smith MP has immense work ahead if he is to rebuild confidence with our constituency," concluded Mr Donaldson.
