

Local traffic surveys

PP&DRA conducted a baseline local traffic survey in 2013 before the new Walton Bridge opened.

We plan to conduct a new survey now that the roadworks in Monument Hill have finished, then again after Morrisons opens. The aim is to see how the new Walton Bridge and Morrisons affect traffic in our roads.



There was more peak hour traffic in Portmore Park Road (St Albans/ Oakdale junction) than Thames Street. A government survey in 2010 showed 15% more traffic in Thames Street over 24 hours.

Why are we doing the surveys?


Traffic may increase with the new bridge – against the edict of the public inquiry – and Morrisons.

Surrey is looking at traffic flows at Walton Bridge, and we understand there may be plans for a strategic review of Weybridge traffic. We want councillors engaged on how our roads adapt.

Friends of Desborough Island

Desborough Island is a wonderful asset for the community of Weybridge, with its acres of tranquil meadow and miles of beautiful riverside.

Friends of Desborough Island (FoDI) is a local initiative to help keep the island a beautiful open space the public can enjoy.

Parts of the island belong to the Environment Agency (responsible for the Thames bank), Surrey County Council, Elmbridge and others. FoDI aims to help keep an eye on the Island, and link in with the Councils, EA, and organisations and groups with an interest in the island.

Community involvement is vital to prevent the lovely Desborough Island regressing into an area for litter, anti-social behaviour and neglect.

Planning application

2014/0884:
Development of warehouse in Thames Street.
Refused, but taken to appeal.

Planners were particularly concerned about the impact on neighbouring properties, as the building forms the boundary walls. Side windows would affect neighbours' privacy.

Believed originally to have been part of the site of Montrose House (demolished in the 1930's for Montrose Walk), some residents remember this as a bus garage and a warehouse for Luxfords.

It is a legacy of a time when much of this part of Weybridge had small industrial sites adjacent to Victorian and Edwardian housing.

This is not an attractive building at present, but the impact of side windows would be undesirable.

Could conversion to dwellings become a more appealing proposition if the design incorporated a central light well, rather than side windows?

REPORT: Meeting with Surrey County Councillor, Christian Mahne

In July Mr Mahne met the PP&DRA committee. Some highlights were:

Mr Mahne said he would enquire to see what funds are required and available and may apply to the Elmbridge Local Committee funds for clearer signage for the next financial year. There will be no new parking schemes beyond those already approved, until the next Weybridge review.	Oakdale Road will become a Residents Parking Area like Elmgrove Road because the proposal was already well advanced.
Weybridge – lacking adequate cycle routes	Thames St and Portmore Park Roads are part of the National Cycle Routes.
Encouraging cycling is a central government focus, and Surrey are looking to improve cycle routes in Weybridge. Initiatives are under consideration for linking the Station to the High Street, West Byfleet and Addlestone.	Previous discussions by residents have noted that these roads have limited space for separation of cyclists from other traffic. What are your views?
A Flood Task Group is publishing its report including Weybridge. Stop press: Just available – see our website. An expectation was a proposal for local wardens with local knowledge.	Because we have two rivers, Weybridge can be affected by different flood patterns. We were lucky that peak flood waters on the Wey and Thames did not coincide last winter.

Other topics coveread included **Green Belt**, **footpaths**, Surrey's view of **gravel extraction** in the area, and **traffic disruption** caused by building work (e.g., Morrisons and St. George's Junior School).

Public access to the riverside

Five years ago, a plan to improve the moorings in our local stretch of riverside resulted in new concrete moorings, funded by the general taxpayer. But it had side effects.



Riverside trees were cut down, and the public were barred by a mesh fence from a riverbank they had previously enjoyed as a public amenity.

On many other parts of the Thames, the public are not barred from riversides where there are moorings.

What are your views? Would you like to see this stretch of riverbank open again for public access?

Meanwhile, there is now an £82,000 proposal to divert the Thames footpath and cyclepath around the riverside edge of the 'Thames Point' car park (next to Weybridge Ladies ARC), halving the parking spaces. **Share your views at our AGM.**

Land at Greenlands Farm has been offered for sale as a 'strategic development opportunity', despite being Green Belt, working floodplain, and an important element of Thames riverside landscape. This farmland, with its traditional field pattern and hedgerows, is a significant piece of local countryside which helps separate Weybridge from Walton. It is included in the Strategic View from historic Oatlands Park. It serves an essential function in helping moderate flood risk.
