Recent studies have shown the extent to which our device usage has grown. Here are a few interesting facts and statistics:

- Did you know that there's a term for your phone addiction?
 Nomophobia is a fear of lack of access to technology
- Two-thirds of adults say the internet is an essential part of their life
- People in the UK now check their smartphones, on average, every 12 minutes of the waking day
- More than half admit that connected devices interrupt face-to-face conversations with friends and family

Figures are taken from recent research conducted by Ofcom in 2018.

1 in 5 adults say they spend more than 40 hours a week online/

The average couple spends over 56 hours a week on their digital devices and less than 2.5 hours doing 'anything' together.

The project is designed to engage with children on 4 Gypsy and Traveller sites across South Wales over a three year period.



Helping you improve your health by reducing fuel poverty

This is a new project which aims to help those living with chronic illnesses whose health is potentially worsened due to poor energy efficiency and fuel poverty. **Well@Home Wales** is a three-year project and is the result of a partnership between Melin Homes, Cardiff Metropolitan University, Monmouthshire and Torfaen Care & Repair and Aneurin Bevan University Health Board.

The project has received funding from the National Grid's Warm Homes Fund to deliver a regional programme within the Aneurin Bevan University Health Board area, allowing health professionals and supporting agencies to refer people who live in privately rented accommodation and homeowners to receive support. This project is aimed at reducing the amount of times people need to visit their GP.

Receive other visitors & direct them to the appropriate person, take delivery of parcels & ensure these are stored securely or passed to the appropriate member of staff, opening & stamping of incoming post, updating spreadsheets, checking of mailbox for messages & returning calls, scanning of client case sheets & attaching to case along with any documentation at the end of each day.

General filing, photocopying, booking of appointments, informing advisors on clients arrival & room allocations, ensure reception area is kept tidy & covered at all times, maintain confidentiality at all times.
