










In **Early Years** the children have been getting into the Christmas spirit. The children are starting to make Christmas crafts and dressing up ready for their performance of The Nativity.


































We then tested our toothpaste to see if they cleaned permanent marker off the mat.





During science lessons in **year 6** we worked in groups testing and building electrical circuits. We then drew our circuits using scientific symbols.

















SPORTS AT HADRIAN

Reuben took up the sport of orienteering two years ago as an extra activity at Hadrian Academy.



Changing to Dolce means using their online system called SchoolGrid which is an online pre-ordering cashless system. This system is similar to ParentMail in that parents can pay by credit or debit card for their child's meals, however payment will be required in advance and you can top up your account as often as you like to ensure that your account is always in credit.


