Today, we manage over forty venues, including sport and leisure facilities, community centres, libraries, community use high schools, museums and a Music and Performing Arts Service.

We are proud to be able to claim that in recent years we have supported every maintained school in Salford with the education and skills development of children and young people from delivering swimming lessons and sports coaching to 6,000 pupils each week, music tuition to a further 2,500 children and young people as well as loaning more than 70,000 books and other resources to schools.

All our services can be tailored to each school's individual needs and flexibility is built in to account for changes in circumstance or priorities. Lesson plans and other services are aligned with the National Curriculum and meet guidelines set by Ofsted and other national and regional bodies.

Staff are qualified in their field with enhanced DBS clearance. We comply with health and safety standards and provide risk assessments for relevant activities

We recognise the importance of ongoing communication and so provide regular updates and assessment reports that monitor pupil progress and demonstrate the value of the services utilised.

SWIMMING SCHEME



Delivered by Amateur Swimming
Association (ASA) qualified teachers,
our school swimming scheme has been
developed over many decades and has
produced many Olympic, Paralympic and
national champions.

Tuition is based upon the ASA's National Plan for the Teaching of Swimming (NPTS) and the requirements of Key Stage 2 in physical education; swimming 25metres unaided using a range of strokes and performing a safe self rescue in different water based situations

WHAT YOU WILL RECEIVE

Our 19 week programme develops pupils from the non swimming stage to a level where they are competent at stroke technique and water skills. Pupils will also receive instruction on personal survival, water safety and simple rescue techniques. We recommend that pupils in year's 4 and 5 attend on a weekly basis for a minimum of 19 x 1 hour lessons.

The swimming teacher is well organised and shows good control and respect of the children.

COSTS

The charge for one session (60 minutes) is £98.00, based on a service level agreement (which includes 2 swimming teachers and excludes transport).

The maximum teacher/pupil ratio is 1:20 for Key Stage 2. For pupils in Key Stage 1 the ratio is reduced to 1:12.



SPORT SPECIFIC COACHING

Our sports development teams can offer daytime delivery for curriculum and GCSE coaching in gymnastics, trampolining, dance and football.

GYMNASTICS & TRAMPOLINING

Primary schools are offered complete term time or annual packages in gymnastics. The delivery is based on the British Gymnastics Key Steps Scheme. We provide the children with the basic skills and understanding to progress and take part in the inter school gymnastics competition.

Secondary schools are offered complete term time or annual packages in trampolining and gymnastics The delivery is based on the British Gymnastics Proficiency Awards Scheme and can lead into advanced coaching for GCSE trampolining or gymnastics.

CLASS VISITS TO MUSEUMS



There are a range of quality learning experiences on offer at both Salford Museum and Art Gallery and Ordsall Hall.

In sessions for Key Stage one and two, pupils can experience what life would have been like in Victorian or Tudor times. Our sessions have been designed to support the National Curriculum and provide plenty of opportunity for follow up work in school. To support classroom work we offer a range of themed loan boxes, which are available to borrow free of charge.

We are also happy to welcome groups of students of key Stage three and above as well as ESOL groups and group tours. You can choose either half or full day sessions, with some sessions available from only $\pounds 2$ per person.

Both sites have been awarded the Sandford Award for Heritage Education and the Learning Outside the Classroom quality badge.

Salford Community Libraries offers primary schools a range of sessions in the library or in school, tailored to your needs:
