### Keynote Part 1 and 2: CONSCIOUS DISCIPLINE!

Triggered and Terribly Tired: The Secrets to Managing Our Emotions In Conscious Discipline we believe that when we become more aware of our feelings we can respond wisely. Consciousness is necessary for this to occur. Emotions are not the BAD Guy, they serve a vital purpose in our lives. They are our internal guidance system. Regulating our emotions includes both acceptance and teaching new strategies. Forty percent of young children are missing the number one skill for school success — self-regulation. How adults respond to children's emotional upset will either foster or inhibit a child's self-regulation. When we can name the emotion, then they can claim it and together we can tame it.
