SARAH'S STORY...



Keen mountain biker Sarah suffered a traumatic brain injury after being catapulted over her handlebars and falling 30 feet onto her head in a disused quarry.

She was unconscious, bleeding and hardly breathing. Due to her deteriorating condition and the fact the quarry was inaccessible by land, the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance was dispatched.

The helicopter was able to fly Sarah to Queen's Medical Centre, Nottingham in just 3 minutes. Due to her injuries she had to stay in hospital for over 4 weeks, but Sarah went on to make an amazing recovery.

TIME IS EVERYTHING!

Preparations for 24-hour operations are continuing to move forward, starting with increased hours of operation on a Friday through to Sunday.

Earlier this year we announced our commitment to providing a 24-hour Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) in Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire – enabling our crew to respond to more of the most serious medical emergencies and accidents than ever before.

The move to fly 24 hours a day is a bold one for our Charity, which has already responded to nearly 20,000 patients since our first mission back in March 1994. At that time we only flew when we had funding to do so, meaning our helicopter was often grounded while we raised the money to fly again. To think that we now have the support needed to fly 24 hours a day is amazing.

Currently, our HEMS crew operates weekdays between 7am and 7pm and 24 hours a day between Friday-Sunday as we build up to a full 24-hour HEMS service which will initially be for a two-year trial period. During this period the medical emergencies our helicopter is dispatched to will be closely reviewed and monitored to

As we move closer to flying 24 hours a day 7 days a week we are already seeing an increase in the number of missions we are dispatched to after the hours of darkness.

ensure that we continue to provide the most appropriate critical care across our two counties. Emergencies don't stop at 7pm – nor will we.

Hundreds of families still have their loved ones today because of the fast actions and expertise of our crew and this is something we are extremely proud of. The increase in the hours that our helicopter will be flying means that we will be one of only three air ambulance charities in the UK to operate a helicopter 24 hours a day, ensuring the people of Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire have the very best pre-hospital critical care possible.

As well as our state-of-the-art helicopter, we also have a Rapid Response Vehicle (RRV) which can quickly transport a Critical Care Paramedic and Doctor to a patient; this vehicle carries the same life-saving equipment as the helicopter. This means we can deliver an advanced level of clinical care and equipment to our patients that goes way above and beyond that of a land ambulance. Our RRV will continue to be used when our helicopter is grounded due to bad weather or unplanned maintenance.

The Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance has been privileged to have received an amazing amount of support from people, organisations and businesses over the last 24 years, enabling us to operate our Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) in Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire saving thousands of lives.

One group that has been tirelessly raising funds over the past two decades is a committee called the Nottinghamshire Air Ambulance Countryside Appeal (NAACA). During this time the committee, consisting of people with links to the farming community, has raised a staggering £500,000 for the Charity.

This money has funded everything from an on-board defibrillator, a training manikin and crew uniforms, to a 4x4 Rapid Response Vehicle and equipment for our airbase at RAF Waddington.

And, this year, the Lincolnshire Air Ambulance County Appeal (LAACA) committee was formed. The committee held its first ever fundraiser - a luncheon at the Epic Centre at Lincolnshire Showground and raised an amazing £80,000 for the Charity – enough to fund approximately 11/2 weeks' worth of potentially life-saving missions.



The sell-out event welcoming almost 600 guests for a delicious 3 course meal, with a double Spitfire fly past to the sound of the RAF Waddington Pipes & Drums Band, and then at the end of the day, having attended 4 potentially life-saving missions the crew of the Air Ambulance Helicopter.

As we receive no direct Government funding, donations such as those from NAACA and LAACA are vital in ensuring we can continue to save lives 365 days of the year. Thank you to both Committees for their hard work and to everyone who has supported them.

Keith Appleyard is just one of the many people who chose to leave a lasting legacy to the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance through a gift in his Will.

Here his niece Linda explains why the Air Ambulance was so important to her uncle:

Uncle Keith was the most generous but also vulnerable man you could meet. He was paralysed down his right side after an accident when

he was 11-years-old when he got hit by a lorry whilst out cycling. Although it was a tough recovery, he still managed to live alone with the help of family and carers.

He would often go to his local nursing home to do the residents' shopping at a drop of a hat. He didn't ask anyone for any help. He was so independent. He also went on regular holidays by himself which he loved, especially Scotland and the Isle of Wight. He had so many friends around him and everyone knew who he was in Coningsby where he lived.

He loved what the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance does. In part because of his own accident, he realised just how important people's lives are and this is why he was a big supporter of the Charity and really appreciated the hard work and dedication of everyone involved. The three ways in which you can leave a legacy:

AS DARKNESS APPROACHED I WAS VERY FORTUNATE THAT THE AIR AMBULANCE WAS ABLE TO ATTEND

It was a day like any other for Mark Desmond as he travelled home on the A18 to Lincoln after a day's work in Grimsby.

But, unbeknown to him, he would soon become the victim of one of around 350 serious road traffic collisions that the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance would respond to that year.

When he awoke the following day in Hull Royal Infirmary, Mark discovered he had been airlifted to hospital by our iconic yellow Ambucopter and had suffered lifethreatening injuries, including 19 broken ribs, a punctured lung, a fractured vertebra and a broken pelvis.

Mark said: "I have no memory of the accident whatsoever; however, it is doubtful that I would have survived without the very timely intervention of the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance. It is a true miracle that I am alive and able to walk, thanks to the dedication and expertise of the Air Ambulance crew. Being a late afternoon on a winter's day I was very fortunate that the Air Ambulance was able to attend at all as darkness approached."

The Air Ambulance crew had been able to put Mark into a medically induced coma before flying him to hospital in time for life-saving surgery. Without this intervention he may not have survived.

Mark was released 3 weeks later and spent a further 10 weeks recuperating at a care home before being able to return home to his wife and family. It was another five months before he could return to work following intense physiotherapy.

This is not the only brush with an Air Ambulance that Mark has had; in 2011 his eldest son was badly injured in a parachuting accident, breaking both femurs and his pelvis and was also air lifted to hospital. He was told his son would not have survived without the Air Ambulance's intervention.

Mark now volunteers at events in a bid to give something back to the Charity that he says saved his life.


THERE FOR YOU IN YOUR GREATEST HOUR OF NEED

Every year our highly trained Pilots, Paramedics and Doctors respond to around 1,000 of the most serious and time critical 999 calls in Lincolnshire & Nottinghamshire. The patients that they encounter are the ones in greatest need.

As we move towards flying 24 hours a day 7 days a week, this number will increase by around 400 per year. Our Charity transports the equivalent of an A&E department to some of the most seriously ill and injured people in the two counties that we cover, giving them their very best chance of survival possible in what is often their greatest hour of need.

The early intervention that our crew provide really can make the difference between life and death to some of the most seriously injured and critically ill men, women and children that we see.

We would like to wish the very best of luck to brave Mum Hayley Hodson, at this years Pride Of Britain Awards! Her outstanding fundraising has helping to raise in excess of £30,000 for three charities including the Lincs & Notts Air Ambulance, following the sad loss of her daughter Amelia aged 11, earlier this year.

Tragedy struck on March 6, when a wheel came off a passing 4x4 vehicle and hit Amelia as she walked for her school bus at Manby Middlegate. Our crew were immediately despatched to the incident and arrived within 11 minutes from take-off, they then flew Amelia to Queens Medical Centre (QMC) in Nottingham. Sadly Amelia later died in hospital.



Following this terrible tragedy we hope that the family took some comfort in meeting the crew that attended Amelia, when they visited our Airbase earlier this year.

The star-studded finals are in London on October 29, where Hayley said she aims to focus on promoting organ donation in memory of Amelia, whose own organs were donated at QMC.
