PLANTING TREES AT ESSEX COUNTY PRESBY MEMORIAL IRIS GARDENS

As if the dazzling display of irises now in full bloom at the Presby Gardens weren't enough, volunteers from the garden joined Essex County Executive Joseph N. DiVincenzo, the NJ Devils, PwC US, and the New Jersey Tree Foundation on May 28 to plant 60 new trees and bushes as part of their "Pucks for Parks" initiative. The greenery, including varieties such as Silver Linden, Hawthorne, Redbud, Ginkgo, Serviceberry, Magnolia, Weeping Beech, Scholar Tree, Lilacs, Fringe Tree and Sweet Pepper Bush, will help bolster the iris population by enhancing natural pollination activity and providing additional pollination avenues in the popular garden. The trees will also help support the Garden's educational arbor program, which was started in 2001.
