Get up to £350 to help improve your broadband speeds

Following the UK Government's commitment to provide access to a minimum of 2 megabits per second (Mbps) download speeds, a broadband subsidy scheme was launched to help eligible residents.

Part of the eligibility criteria is that you're unable to access download speeds of 2 Mbps or more, and are not in any current fibre broadband rollout plans.

You can apply for a voucher worth up to £350 towards the hardware and installation costs to get connected to alternative broadband technologies such as satellite, 4G and wireless. You would still be required to pay any additional costs such as the monthly service charge which starts at £10.

The scheme is open to both residents and businesses, and applications need to be submitted by 31 December 2018.

If you'd like to know more about the scheme and how these technologies can benefit you, members of the Digital Durham team will be available at the UTASS office in Middleton-in-Teesdale on Tuesday 13 March between 12noon – 6.00pm.

Charity Donations taken at UTASS until 30th June 2018

Sue Ryder provides person-centred hospice and neurological care for people facing a frightening, life-changing diagnosis. If you have any unwanted clothes items, household goods, toys, etc. that you would like to donate to the Sue Ryder Charity UTASS will be acting as a collection point until the end of June 2018.

Thereafter we will operate a rolling programme of collections for various charities.

Good Neighbours Scheme

A local resident contacted UTASS about a Good Neighbours Scheme operating in Cumbria which she thought might work well locally. Good Neighbour Schemes (GNS) aim to counter the loss of services and are generally set up to cater for older or disabled residents in a community. A GNS involves setting up a pool of volunteers who would undertake

small jobs such as changing light bulbs, light gardening, shopping, errands, small household tasks, picking up prescriptions, lifts to visit relatives or friends in hospitals or care homes, telephone/social contact, etc. If you are prepared to join a local GNS as a volunteer or you could do with some help with small jobs and tasks or a phone call every now and then to chat to someone – please contact UTASS on 01833 641010.





Sessions for young people at UTASS take place during school term time and include Monday Girls Group 6pm to 8pm (8-13 year olds) and Thursday mixed gender drop in 6pm to 7.30pm (8-11 year olds) then 7.30pm – 9pm (12-19 year olds or up to 25 year old for those with additional needs).

Service Users Survey of 2017 Findings


This year, due to our application to the Big Lottery Fund for continuation funding, our service users survey was sent out much earlier and with a much shorter deadline that previous years...







NHS England Consultation:

Reducing prescribing of over the counter medicines

What is the consultation?

NHS England launched a public consultation on 20 December 2017 in relation to reducing prescribing of over-the-counter (OTC) medicines for minor, short-term health concerns which could save the NHS millions of pounds a year and encourage more people to self-care. Patients, members of the public, and NHS staff are encouraged to feed into the consultation as the resulting guidance will be used to inform what is available on prescription from your GP in your local area

How can I get involved?

You can respond to the consultation by using the online form at https://www.engage.england.nhs.uk/consultation/over-the-counter-items-not-routinely-prescribed/user-uploads/otc-guidance-2.pdf



Thanks to The Wellesley Trust at The Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland and The Hedley Foundation, another Lantra 13-15 Tractor Driving training was held on 24th February and there are still spaces available for future dates, as well as for Quad Bike Training & Pre-Test Tractor Driving. So far this year 7 successful applicants have been reimbursed for their driver training.

The UTASS British Wool Shearing Course date has been confirmed for Wednesday, 27th & Thursday, 28th June, to be held in Woodland by kind permission of John & Fay Hutchinson. Whether you are a beginner or wanting to improve your technique, our usual excellent instructors, will be there to help to make shearing a better experience for all involved! We would like to thank Weardale Action Partnership and John Warren ABP for providing part funding for all trainees last year and hope to have some some funding available again for 2018.

Thanks to all those who attended last year and congratulations on the British Wool "Seals" they achieved.

Trying to get sufficient numbers to run The NPTC Safe Use of Pesticides and/or NPTC City & Guilds Level 2 Award in Land-based Forklift Truck Operations (Rough Terrain, Masted and Telescopic Types) training and assessments in early/mid March. Computer Training

This training was delivered during November and December by our usual trainer, Sarah Peart from Frosterley, who is an Accountant and farmer. We would like to thank The Sir James Knott Trust for making funding available towards the cost. Whilst most of the subject matter for the "<u>Getting On Line</u>" basic training had a farming theme, the skills and knowledge gained enabled trainees to do lots of things online, with sessions covering:

- 1. How to get online "What do I need to Know?"
- 2. **Online already & like to know more ...** How to send & receive e-mails including attachments (including managing e-mails when online e.g. using Gmail)
- 3. **Using the "Whole Farm Approach"** to access BCMS & VAT online & more (password required beforehand to access this service instructions available prior to the course to facilitate this)

4. **How to submit VAT online** using existing records for working out (or progressing to using Sarah's Excel VAT training).

The more advanced 5 weeks training "VAT using Excel" enabled 6 trainees to learn how to input their farm payments and receipts into Sarah's specially designed spreadsheet which calculates the amount of VAT to claim/payable each quarter. Trainees also learn how to check formulae and lots of useful information relevant to VAT, when the sessions ran from 4.15-6.45pm on Wednesdays. Trainees were able to start inputting data right from the first session by bringing along their own invoices and receipts. One trainee commented "Learnt about spreadsheets, VAT, working out VAT, understanding it all a lot better. Just need to put into practice."

Vehicle Training to Improve Employability

We would very much like to thank the Wellesley Trust Fund at The Community Foundation Tyne & Wear and Northumberland for the opportunity for young people to access driver training and to thank applicants too. Unfortunately there were a lot more applications than spaces for the Trailer & Car Lessons, however due to this high demand, we applied to a

second funder and we are so grateful to The Hedley Foundation for providing more funding, with previous applicants for car lessons or trailer lessons not needing to reapply.

- 4 for Trailer lessons in preparation for B+E Test
- 6 for NPTC City & Guilds Level 2 Award in Land-based Forklift Truck Operations (Rough Terrain, Masted and Telescopic Types) (2 days training)
- 8 for Emergency First Aid Training (1 days training fully funded)
- 2 for Dry Stone Walling (3 day course held October 17 and pictured below)

We also have a few names for Spraying and Telehandler training and for the Emergency First Aid training. If you would like to apply an application form is available on the UTASS website or from the UTASS office.



Adam has decided to retire from this role and has handed over the management of the scheme to UTASS.

The existing 130 group members will already have been contacted by Adam about the changes, however, going forward UTASS welcomes others to join the scheme which offers a 2.5p per litre discount.

UTASS intends to keep the timings of invitations of oil orders and the placing of orders the same as it always has been i.e. an invitation to place orders will go out to members in the middle of the month and group members should place their orders by midnight on the last day of the month. Members will then be advised of the price per litre and anticipated start date of deliveries.

Membership of the group is FREE and the minimum order amount is 500 litres.
