July is a great month to help our animal friends who congregate in the garden and on our grounds. You still need to be aware that birds are nesting right up until August so be careful cutting back trees. Clean and top up birdbaths and feeders as the birds will be glad of the water. Also top up ponds, ideally with rainwater and remove dead foliage. Blanket weed can also be a problem so carefully remove using a garden fork and leave by the side of the pond so any creatures within it can crawl back into the water.
