### Sana s.l. Murcia, Spain

In 2004 Compost Reciclables s.l (Sana) installed their first single chamber VCU system at their site in Murcia, Spain. The plant processes a variety of organic wastes from the region including squid waste. The facility remains the only ABP compliant composting plant in the region. In 2008 Sana ordered an additional 3 chamber VCU system as part of the expansion of their site. The expansion is now complete and will enable Sana to quadruple the amount of ABP waste they can treat, allowing further diversion of waste from landfill.

"We chose the system initially because of its ability to meet EU ABP requirements, its small footprint and its potential for expansion" explained Sana's owner Manuel Valenzuela. "We have not been disappointed with the system which has proven to very reliable over the 4 years of operation".

The decision to expand came as a result of the increasing need for more processing capacity for ABP waste in the region. Manuel added "We had no hesitation in expanding the VCU as it provides a cost effective solution to handling our community's waste".
