

<u>LPF05 – Conflict Minerals Letter Master Copy</u>

Dear Supplier,

In 2012 the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) provided final rules regarding conflict minerals reporting for gold, tin, tantalum and tungsten used in products and manufacturing. Publicly-traded US companies and suppliers must now disclose if they use these metals and what efforts have been undertaken to ensure those metals do not contribute to armed conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo and surrounding areas.

Linwave Technology is committed to sourcing responsibly and considers mining activities that fuel conflict as unacceptable. It is also committed to providing the required information to our US customers. Linwave's efforts related to conflict minerals are aligned to the work of the Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) and Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI). The EICC's and GeSI's work includes the Conflict-Free Smelter Program and the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template.

As part of this effort, we are committed to working with our suppliers to conduct due diligence and implement policies and procedures such that they can provide all necessary information for Linwave to allow us to make proper and accurate disclosures as and when required.

Therefore, please be advised that we require you to complete and return the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template, Revision 2.03a, which can be found attached. The template, which is being widely adopted throughout the supply chain, from smelters to finished product manufacturers, provides a concise and straightforward way to collect and enable roll-up of conflict mineral information

When completing the Template, please note:

- All of Linwave's global suppliers must complete and submit Revision 2.03a of the Template
- Complete mine and smelter location address must be submitted for any smelter that is not included in the dropdown menus in the Template
- If you will be reporting "Uncertain" or "Unknown" for questions regarding Tantalum, Tin, Gold or Tungsten originating from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries (question #2 from template) OR if you answered "Unknown" regarding whether all smelters used by you or your suppliers have been validated as compliant with the Conflict-Free Smelter (CFS) program- please advise, by what date (mm/dd/yyyy) do you plan to report?

The Template must be submitted to Nicola Cawte, Procurement Planner at Linwave Technology Ltd, within 3 weeks of the date of this email.
