

This long-established trail offers an unhurried opportunity to buy original artwork – from paintings and prints to stone sculptures and jewellery – with a myriad of objects between. North Bristol Artists look forward to this weekend as an opportunity to show off the artwork they have been creating throughout the year. It's a perfect time of year to inspire people to buy original artwork and craft for loved ones. Trail-goers can enjoy visiting artists in their own homes and studios, while bumping into friends and soaking up the atmosphere of streets bustling with art lovers. Some of our artists are recognised at regional and national levels for their art, craft or design work, others are working on international commissions. For some of these ambitious, full-time



artists, the trail offers a network of like-minded people and also keeps them in contact with a public.

The skills of North Bristol Artists are wide and varied – from curating exhibitions, publishing books and starting new arts projects in education – to community support and public works. The North Bristol Art Trail is a time for every member to connect with the local community and share the wonderful wealth of art in the area.





Once you fall in love with a piece of art you can pay with cash, Bristol Pounds or old-fashioned cheques. Many artists are also set up to take card payments There are even specially created NBA vouchers which can be purchased at Room 212. These beautiful vouchers are a great present to give to a friend or loved one to encourage them to buy from North Bristol Artists. They can be used all year round at Room 212 or by contacting artists directly.



The North Bristol Artists PHOTO **PORTRAIT PROJECT**

For most enthusiastic supporters, or even for casual visitors, the annual North Bristol Art Trail is just a 'once a year' event that brightens those sometimes gloomy week-ends in late November. Only the participating artists and their friends and family know just how much work goes on throughout the year to make this magical and now legendary weekend happen and what other interesting projects are taking place that involve this diverse range of talented creatives.

In his latest project, photographer and long time North Bristol Artist (NBA), Paul Bullivant, is aiming to meet and photograph in portrait style all of the now more than 100 members. After 12 months he has met nearly one third of his target, photographing his fellow artists at home, in their studios, in their gardens and sometimes on the street. With an ever changing membership, this project is unlikely to be fully completed but Paul hopes that this archive, recording the work and personalities of his fellow artists, may one day become an exhibition and a book, perhaps celebrating the fast approaching 20th anniversary of the founding of 'the trail'.

Paul's first subject, NBA's Chair Mary Collett (pictured), is enthusiastic about the project:

"Paul's project is a unique record of an unusual and diverse range of talented people who contribute so much to the local community and to Bristol. Our trail, along with the many others that now take place across the city, is a part of what makes Bristol a



creative ideas. interesting events and exciting opportunities."

Happy 20th Anniversary **Gasworks Choir!**

This autumn, Gasworks Choir is 20 years old. In 1997, when Dee Jarlett and Ali Orbaum, both singers in Sweet Soul Sisters, tentatively placed an ad in Venue Magazine for people who'd like to sing harmony together - without accompaniment or the need to read music - they were astonished by the response. Around 100 people answered the ad and Bristol's first community choir sparked into life.

Soon, they were rehearsing in the Gasworks Studio, St Werburghs, and performing regularly at St George's, dressed distinctively in red and orange and delighting audiences with an eclectic repertoire of a cappella songs. Many songs were brilliantly arranged by Dee and Ali, such as Labi Siffre's anti-apartheid anthem Something Inside So Strong and Paul Simon's Bridge over Troubled Water, the latter sung recently in 2017 by 800 singers at Totally Thames Festival's 'Sing for Water'.

The choir's singers hail from various parts of Bristol, including Bishopston, Horfield, Henleaze, Ashley Down, St Werburghs, Redland and St Andrews. Bishopston resident Jorge Sved says that, "The choir leaders strike the perfect balance between professionalism and fun: we achieve a fantastic sound by the time we perform our songs in public without it feeling like hard work to get there."

At one point the choir was so popular that people had to wait six years to join! Thanks to the explosion of similar choirs in Bristol, the wait is not nearly so long. Gasworks Choir continues to refresh itself with new singers every year, creating a bright blend of voices and maintaining its unique reputation as one of the best community choirs in our thriving singing city.

In June 2017, led by Ali and her talented co-leader Jessica Samuel, the 160-strong choir performed al fresco at midsummer in St Andrews Park, and on Sunday 17 December they will be holding a special anniversary gala concert at St George's.

"Where Nurture Meets Nature"

It was a pleasure to take time out this month to meet Lizzie Staite and Janie Ankers – local mums and two of the co-founders of North Bristol's first forestbased Pre-School opening in January 2018.

Little Foxes' ethos is simple: they believe that there is no better place for children to learn, grow and thrive than in nature. With more and more opportunities for children to be in front of screens and indoors these days, they took it upon themselves to try to offer the young children of Bristol a chance to connect with the great outdoors.

Little Foxes Forest Pre-School will be open for 3 and 4 year olds on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 9:30am– 2:30pm term time only.

Parents can sign up for one, two or three days. Every day the children's learning will take place in the beautiful surroundings of Stoke Park Estate in BS7. From spotting shapes during nature walks, to sparking imagination on gruffalo hunts, the Pre-school will harness the diversity of the forest surrounding to develop curious and creative little minds.

Lizzie, Janie and Julie (the three co-founders of Little Foxes) have over 25 years of combined experience as qualified teachers in the primary school sector and as registered child-minders. They have been successfully running an oversubscribed playgroup for years and felt it was time to expand as the demand for outdoor learning is growing all the time. Janie went on to explain: "From our time teaching and at the playgroup, we are constantly amazed at just what an impact being in nature has on children. Children really do become more resilient, happy learners. They challenge themselves further; it's incredibly rewarding to watch the natural connection children have with the forest, especially when we live in such a big city."



"Studies have shown that children who learn outdoors all day have fewer allergies and move twice as much as those in traditional settings."

Little Foxes pride themselves on having a high adult to child ratio of 1:5 (government guidelines are 1:13 at this age) to get to know children really well and to keep them safe. The Pre-School also has a strong emphasis on fresh, healthy and wholesome food. Lizzie



says: "Children will be encouraged to be a part of the mealtime process, often helping to cook their lunches over the fire."

Naturally, the Pre-School that only launched in September has gathered lots of interest. Spaces for the January intake were full within a month and they are now taking names for waiting lists. A report from the **Bishopston Society AGM. Tuesday 3 October 2017**

These meetings in the past are well supported and so it's encouraging that, a year on, there are still a lot of familiar faces and some new, who attended the Society's AGM.

After a concise summary of the finances, activities and future strategy, the Chair was able to introduce us to councillor Fi Hance - BCC Cabinet Member for Health & Wellbeing.

It's a concerning fact that Bishopston air quality needs improving - and its diesel cars that are a main contributor to this reality. Fi was able to highlight this with her map of a recent study she led on Clean Air. Fi and Bristol City Council are working cross-party with community interest groups to find solutions to improve the air that we breathe. And it does seem we are heading in the right direction with cycling and public transport on the increase. In addition, with funding from the EU by 2020, the council hopes to have doubled charging points across the city for electric cars. And, for the future, there is talk of Clean Air Zones – not quite the congestion charge – but a charge on cars pre-Euro 6 Diesel.

Dr Caroline Bartle of UWE discussed the challenges of changing our travel behaviours and what can help to that end, from travel plans, to car clubs, to cycling maps and real-time travel information, which all help people to make alternative choices. Did you know that Bishopston has a higher ownership of cars than the UK average? So perhaps it is worth considering the other options?

Almost one-fifth of Bristol's residents walk to work. This is the highest proportion of any core city, and the number increased by 40% between 2001 and 2011. The Bristol Walking Alliance is a coalition of about 20 organisations that campaign to make our streets safe and pleasant walkable spaces and to get even more people out and about on foot.

News from U3A

If you have been reading Bishopston Matters over the last few months, you may well have read the articles about the U3A, the University of the Third Age. The U3A is an international movement, whose aims are the education and stimulation of people in the "third age" of their life. This age, actually has nothing to do with time or the members' true age, but simply the time in life when people give up full-time work, in favour of some form of retirement.

The movement started in France as a university activity, but attracted the attention of Cambridge University academic, Peter Laslett in 1981. He hosted a conference in Cambridge to discuss the possibility of bringing the U3A to the UK. This triggered an invitation to Eric Midwinter, who was concerned with ageing, to talk about the French U3A on the BBC radio programme You and Yours. No fewer than 400 letters were received and the UK U3A was born.

The French model of being affiliated to a university was rejected in favour of the self-help model that we have today. Peter Laslett wanted

groups of people to get together to learn about what interested them, not a prescribed syllabus. He also wanted 100% participation by the membership with the ethos, 'The Teacher Shall Learn and The Pupil Shall Teach'.

The first U3A, understandably, started in Cambridge, and in spite of a lot of difficulties with funding, and the usual differences of opinion, the organisation grew. Within 10 years, new U3As were forming at the rate of one a fortnight. There are now over 1000 UK towns, villages and regions, which have their own U3A, and there are nearly 500,000 members.

Bristol U3A has nearly 2000 members and there are over 130 special interest groups, ranging from Architecture to Yoga, including Tai Chi, Table Tennis, Poetry, Jazz, Majong, History, the list is endless. On Saturday 7 October, Ardagh Community Trust was delighted to host a Community Business Weekend 'Open Doors' event. which gave us a chance to share updates about our latest news and the work we are doing with visitors, friends and supporters. The event was great fun, well attended and - despite the rain! - gave us the chance to share lots of information about our developing plans

for the future. It was also a lovely opportunity to celebrate our achievements to date!

We will shortly be launching a new membership scheme, which will enable local people to become members of the charity and to have a real say in how our work develops, so it was a great opportunity to share information about this. 





First Aid for your Pet!



First aid in pets has been a talking point recently, with Jodie Marsh sharing a video of herself performing CPR on her dog, who sadly died a few days later.

To perform pet CPR it is best that you have had some veterinary-lead training in how to do this; Jodie's video should not be used as a quide as she herself admits her technique is not perfect. CPR is also performed differently depending on the size of the dog and is also very different if you own a cat, rabbit or other species.

after 5 minutes or if

they have more than one seizure in a row.

However, there are other things you can do in a first aid situation that can be helpful.

The first thing is to keep calm and take a moment to check the situation first, that there is no danger to yourself; be careful, as injured animals may be afraid, in pain and may bite.

With wounds, apply pressure if they are actively bleeding using a clean towel, if the blood seeps through then apply a second layer over the top of the first. Burns should be bathed in cool water for at least 10 minutes.

If your pet is having a seizure then keep calm, minimise noise and move household items out of the way so they do not harm themselves. Call a

If it is their first seizure, but it resolves in under 5 minutes, it is still worth calling the vet to book an appointment for them to be checked over.

If you think your pet is suffering from hypothermia then we advise wrapping them in a warm blanket and calling your vet. With hyperthermia (being too warm) then try to cool them down slowly with cold water soaked towels and offer them water. Both hypothermia and hyperthermia are very dangerous so call the vet ASAP for advice.

With all situations involving first aid, call your vet as soon as possible to let them know what has happened, to get emergency advice and to book your pet an appointment to be checked over by a veterinary professional.



Resistance Training for a Longer Life


As we age an investable condition called sarcopenia causes our muscle mass to decrease. Research has suggested this decrease in muscle mass is lost at 0.5–1% per year after the age of 50. This means by the time we are 60 we could have a lost around 10% of our total muscle mass! This reduction means we lose strength and can lead to fractures and falls in later life.

So how Can I Improve My Muscle Mass?

Any form of resistance training can help increase your muscle mass this includes

- Weight training using weighted bars, machines or dumbbells
- Body weight training (using your own body weight as resistance)

Generally, the more active you are the higher amount of muscle mass you will have. This picture shows an inactive person vs an active person.

How do I Start Resistance Training?

Firstly, you can start with body weight training, which needs no equipment and can be done at home. There are some example exercises below. Try one set of 10 repetitions twice per week with 48 hours rest inbetween.



The Future of the Memorial Ground

Bristol Rovers to stay at the site

A recent frank and promising meeting of Bristol Rovers FC directors with a group of local residents, bodes well for further dialogue between the club and its neighbours. The meeting was arranged by Friends of the Memorial Ground (FOMG), to discuss the intention of Dwane Sports Ltd, who are the owners of Bristol Rovers, to rebuild the Memorial Stadium.

The two key 'take-aways' were that Dwane Sports is considering building a new stadium with a capacity of about 17,000–20,000 (which is 5,000–8,000 more than the current capacity) and that the new stadium would be self-funded.

We discussed revenue stream ideas to complement the football-related business, such as a gym, a school, a medical centre, conference/wedding reception rooms, etc. – facilities available to all and not only on match days. Rovers are seeking further suggestions from the community and fans.

In a spirit of co-operation and a shared interest in a sustainable/successful future for the stadium, FOMG emphasised that a wide range of creative solutions to match day traffic and parking would be necessary. The club recognises that research into fans' travel patterns was needed. Rovers are putting up bicycle stands. We discussed other options, including providing incentives to fans to cycle or walk to matches, shuttle buses to Kingswood, Easton, Temple Meads, etc., a deal with local bus companies, pooling resources and solutions with Gloucestershire County Cricket Club, park & ride, park & stride, car sharing, and the setting up of a match-day-only residents parking zone.

The Memorial Ground is to be rededicated to commemorate Bristol rugby players killed in wars since 1945. Bristol Rugby Former Players are applying for funding to professionally restore the listed entrance gates. FOMG and Rovers are to explore the possibility of re-planting the Scots pines around the ground's perimeter, where these are now missing.

As the stadium's redevelopment plans evolve, further dialogue between the club and local residents – and a thorough community consultation – are envisaged. The Bishopston Society has kindly offered to facilitate this.

Local History Matters *Some Horfield Cottages*

In June 1655, Thomas Wade, a copyhold tenant of Horfield manor, was granted licence to live elsewhere, having found a fit (i.e. capable) person to rent his farm and farmstead 'for the terme of seaven yeares from the feast of St John the Baptist (June 24th) next ensuing'. Thomas Wade, or any other copyholder entering such an agreement, also committed himself to 'repayre the houses pay the rents and performe and do all other dutyes customes & services due and payable for the said premisses', as outlined in the Customs of Horfield Manor.

Sometimes, copyholders tried to shrug off responsibility for paying their dues, as for example, in a presentment of 1776 – that the house now belonging to the Widow Pye within this Manor and rented by George Davis wants a new Window frame in the Kitchen, a new Lintern over the Kitchen door and a new Lintern over the Barn door and some Tiling on the Barn.

Two other cases were presented at the same court, one by Widow Townsend and the other a second property by Widow Pye. The verdict for all three (tithe nos. 109, 17 and 112, respectively) was that each widow should carry out repairs to her copyhold(s) by Lady Day (March 25th).

Sometimes, people took matters into their own hands. In 1804, William Thomas – erected a Cottage in a Lane from the Church between late Attwood Estate leading to an Estate late Townends and the Bailiff is hereby directed to give the said William Thomas, notice to remove the said Cottage and Building as an Infringement on the Liberties of the said Manor.


The '*lane from the church*' was part of an abandoned highway (tithe no.91) which William Thomas had appropriated for his own use. In spite of the threats, no-one removed '*the said Cottage*' and in 1809 the lane

was further '*inclosed by William Matthews to the prejudice of the Copyholders*'. There may have been sympathy for the Thomas/Matthews cause, and some may have seen the building of a cottage on 'the Waste belonging to the said Lord of the Manor' in 1794 as a benign precedent. Other cottages were built in Horfield at about the same time: the cottage in three parts (tithe no.177abc) occupied by Young, Vickery, and George Thomas, and Eleonor Sanders' Ship alehouse (tithe no.183). Thomas Book's cottage, (tithe no.95), at the head of Ashley lane, was irrelevant, since it was owned, not by the Lord of the Manor, but by the Bristol Turnpike Trust.

By 1817, a different kind of conflict over land use in Horfield had begun to emerge – *the hedge of the northern side of a Close of Land parcel of the Copyhold of David Davis one of the Copyholders of this Manor is prostrated and the ditch thereof nearly filled up the pathway between the said Close and Mr Lamberts garden wall laid open to the tread of cattle whereby the same is rendered founderous and the said wall much endangered at the foundation. It is hereby ordered that the said David Davis do cause a proper fence to be made between the said Close and footway before 25th day of March next.*

The ditch ran between Lambert's gentrified acre (tithe no.62) and Davis's Allhays (tithe no 61). In all the

- circumstances, particularly the potential danger to life, the verdict of erecting 'a proper fence' by
- 60 Davis seems to have been the right one.



HBC at 125 – how the church was built in Horfield

Horfield Baptist Church (HBC) enjoys its 125th anniversary this year, although it hasn't always been in the same place throughout those years. How it got to be where it is today – the familiar two towered church building on Gloucester Road – is an interesting story.

1882 – It began when a group from Broadmead Baptist Church decided to set up a "mission room" in Horfield. £7 and 10 shillings was donated to the project along with the "loan of a harmonium". A house in Thornleigh Road was rented and the seed of the church sown.

1889 – A rapid growth in numbers and activities saw the need for a new home and the church erected an iron building, "the Tin Tabernacle", on Gloucester Road. Many contributed to the cost, including "five shillings from the children of Number 5 Orphan House, Ashley Down".

1895 – A more permanent building for the church was decided upon and a chapel on Brynland Avenue built. Only three years later, plans were laid and fundraising commenced for what is now the current church on Gloucester Road.

1900 – The church's foundation stone was laid and the first service held there in 1901.

1919 – The decision was taken that new Memorial Buildings should be built next to the church in "memory of the church members who had served and those who had fallen in the Great War". The building opened in 1922. The Memorial Buildings were for the use of the church's

"school, institute and brotherhood". They still provide a well-used home for church activities and rooms for community use, and most noticeably they house the church's Fresh Ground Café. Look out for the 1921 foundation stone near the café door with the famous name Lloyd George (it was laid by the Prime Minister's wife, Dame Margaret) and step inside to try the present-day coffee and cake!

The church plans a celebration event for its anniversary on Sunday 3 December – more details to follow. You would be very welcome and we hope you can come along to be part of our continuing story. www.horfieldbaptist.net

The site of the Business Centre was formerly a social club built in 1963 and was a well-frequented venue with some very popular bands playing there. The club fell into disrepair in 2015 and was closed, creating a burden for St Bon's, who owns the building.

Thanks to a forward-thinking new Parish Priest, Fr Tom Smith, and a highly motivated and dedicated group of parishioners, a new plan was formulated - that the building would be an asset to the Bishopston community once again and provide a much-needed income for the church.

St Bon's Church and Friary were built in 1900 and are large, impressive buildings with maintenance budgets to match. The closed social club was a drain on precious resources, so Fr Tom appealed to the parishioners and was able to crowd fund the money needed to convert it into a modern business centre.

One of the parishioners, Tony Nelson, runs his own company project managing commercial refurbishments and large office moves. Tony

volunteered significant amounts of time and energy into overseeing the amazing transformation, even laying the carpet tiles himself to reduce costs.

Fr Tom approached Bristol Spaceworks through a mutual contact to manage the business centre and let the fully furnished office spaces. Bristol Spaceworks is a not-for-profit company established in 1985, which owns and manages four business centres in Bristol. They rent office space, warehouses and art studios on flexible agreements with the aim of stimulating employment. As well as reinvesting any profits into the upkeep of the buildings, the company has donated to several local charitable causes.

Fr Tom Smith said, "This is an exciting project; it is the result of the hard work of many people and the generosity and support of many of our parishioners. The offices are of a high quality and I hope it will become the go-to business space for Bishopston."

Matt Johnstone, Bristol Spaceworks' Chief Executive said, "We have always operated in the heart of diverse communities. The opportunity to work with Fr Tom and his team at St Bon's was an exciting new challenge. It fits well with our ethos of working in the community, to provide professionally run workspaces, which help people develop and grow their business. Fr Tom, Tony and the rest of parishioners have created a really modern business centre with potential for future expansion on the same site."

Redland ward news

Air quality update -

Many local people have taken an interest in recent Bishopston Society events focussed on air quality, in spring and this autumn. We've been delighted to take part in these in various capacities.

Somewhat frustratingly, the council's plans to continue with a feasibility study into what measures will bring our air guality up to legal standards have been thwarted by a government direction issued in late summer. Fortunately for us, the lawyers Client Earth (who forced the government to take action) spotted that we had used cost as a criterion in selecting potential options, which in the direction government stipulated was not allowable. Officers are now negotiating with government what costs they mean (social, local health?) and also clarifying other matters such as the area of Bristol which doesn't meet legal standards. Government's assessment is rather different from the council's! We'll keep you posted but meanwhile do look out for ways to get involved in the local air quality debate and consider how you can help prevent pollution as Gloucester Road and the main routes in the city are corridors that affect local health.

Residents parking –

Unfortunately, at the time of writing there is still no clear procedure by which new Residents Parking Schemes can be initiated. We know that not everyone is a fan, but there are increasing numbers of residents from various parts of our ward contacting us asking for a scheme to be installed in their street. We are pressing for clarification, but until we know what process the Highways department is adopting, we are somewhat hamstrung. Do keep in touch with any comments or opinions on the matter. The Mayor has said any scheme has to have high levels of support, and projects cannot be piecemeal extensions of the RPS. We'll report more when we know what this means.

Food waste -

Did you know that the most significant recyclable item in people's black bins is food waste? There's

still far too much of the stuff going into the fortnightly residual waste bins, causing nasty whiffs and of course costing the council precious money to dispose of. Fi had the absolute pleasure of visiting Geneco in Avonmouth recently, where along with the waste of 1 million people's toilets, all our food waste is processed into valuable bio methane, farming compost and electricity generation. Nothing is wasted! Bristol Waste will be launching a campaign soon to encourage residents to keep their food waste out of their black bins. Other initiatives are also in the pipeline to help people reduce the amount of food waste created in the first place. Meanwhile Martin has a petition live on the council website collecting signatures calling for the council to tackle single use disposable plastics. Look for the petitions page (see http:// epetitions.bristol.gov.uk/epetition core/view/ plasticsban) and sign it if you'd like to see more done to get rid of plastic waste.

Changes to Neighbourhood arrangements and funding –

We've reported before how the demise of Neighbourhood Partnerships means we're supporting community efforts to keep local initiatives running in our area, like tackling flytipping, graffiti, and supporting local projects. Do get in touch with the steering group at info@bcrnp. org.uk to help if you can.

But local projects need funding too. Up to now each NP area (usually 3 wards, like Bishopston, Cotham and Redland) has been allowed to keep 15% of the compulsory funds from developers in the area called Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). The other 85% is kept by the Mayor for projects like the Arena. Now there's a proposal – following the recent consultations about neighbourhoods – to increase the size of the areas allocated the 15%. This may become a 6-ward area stretching from our ward as far as Brentry and Southmead. We have concerns about how local input through meetings and committees will work in future as this could affect how the funds get used to deal with impacts from the developments that take place.

Did you know that in the First World War the British Army considered delivering letters and parcels to the Front as important as delivering rations and ammunition?



Bishopston Library will be hosting the touring exhibition of Parcels of Comfort, from now to 25 November. The exhibition includes textile parcels, appliqué, embroidery, printmaking and knitting. The parcels replicate the ones that were sent to the front line in WW1 by friends and family.

All the sewing and knitting has been done by hand to create an empathy with that era. The subject has been carefully researched including using the names of real soldiers featured in the We Have Our Lives and in the book Letters From the Trenches by local author Jacqueline Wadsworth.

Bristol Artists Sally Stanley, Paula New, Jane Marie-Mahy, Lucy Saunders and Jane Kay have used mixed media to recreate the atmosphere of the time, including knitting from original wartime patterns. In addition, GCSE Textile students from Cotham School have helped to represent some of the other items in the parcels.
