In addition to a stellar lineup of luncheon speakers and a spectacular Gala honoring Jim McNerney with our Distinguished Achievement Award, we made real progress in our mission to support students studying for careers in aviation. We also advanced our objectives in supporting organizations that use aircraft to help those in need and to provide programs that educate students about the field of aviation.

Last year we expanded our scholarship programs, adding two new grants for the Children of Fallen Patriots Foundation. Overall, we presented scholarships to eight very talented students at the recent Annual Awards Gala. We were also pleased to recognize Airlink for the

extraordinary work that they do as a rapid-response humanitarian relief organization.

During the past year, our Aerospace on Campus Program continued to expand. In partnership with Aviation Week Network, the Wings Club presented speaking events at the University of Southern California, California Polytechnic State University and a special event at Cranfield University in the U.K. To date, the Aerospace on Campus program has been presented to over 1,100 students at nine universities.

We kicked off our 2017 Aviation Leader Luncheon series in January with Pedro Heilbron of Copa Holdings, and have a great schedule of speakers lined up for the coming months. Our featured speaker in February will be Bob Fornaro, President and CEO of Spirit Airlines. In March we will host Jeffery Immelt, Chairman and CEO of GE, and in April our speaker will be Paolo Cesar de Souza e Silva, President and CEO of Embraer. In May we will celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Wings Club with Delta CEO Ed Bastian as our luncheon speaker, and we'll close out the first half of the year with Oscar Munoz, President and CEO of United Airlines in June.

Our ability to attract these industry leaders and the success of all of our initiatives would not be possible without the substantial support of the Wings Club membership. Through your generosity and active engagement, our programs continue to grow and prosper.

HIGHLIGHTSFROM WINGS CLUB EVENTS SEE WHAT YOU MISSED



September 22, 2016 – Sight Lecture Mr. John Leahy Chief Operating Officer – Customers Airbus

Remarking that "the keys to the future are often found in the past," Mr. Leahy proceeded to use the Sight Lecture to deliver a virtual tutorial on the past 40 years in the aviation industry. Citing the introduction of the Boeing-747 in January 1970 as the event that "heralded the mass aviation age," he also noted it was the year Airbus was founded. He described deregulation in 1978 as the "critical factor that helped drag the industry out of the dark ages," and enumerated key aviation events over the intervening years. This included carrier alliances, frequent flier programs, the advent of low-cost airlines, the introduction of the A-320 family and the continued innovation in aircraft design and technology that have brought the industry to where it is today. Making the point that global demand for air travel had more than doubled every 15 years since 1970, he concluded that flying had made a profound impact in the way people live in the US and in countries all over the world. "The best thing is, so far, we have succeeded. Let's keep it up."



October 21, 2016 – 74th Annual Awards Gala Mr. W. James (Jim) McNerney, Jr. Retired Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer, The Boeing Company Recipient of the 2016 Distinguished Achievement Award

Noting that the Distinguished Achievement Award was a "personal high point for me," Mr. McNerney spoke directly to the people from Boeing. "It would not have happened without your insights, contribution and collaboration, which I not only valued but relied upon heavily along the way," he stated. "Those of us fortunate enough to lead storied companies like Boeing recognized early on that we have a commitment to posterity. We have a duty to leave them not just in better shape financially and competitively than when we arrived, but to leave them more ethical, more responsible, more respected and in a better position to make sustained contributions to our nation and our world."



November 17, 2016 – Aviation Leaders Luncheon Mr. Alex Cruz Chairman and Chief Executive Officer British Airways

Mr. Cruz began his remarks by outlining his time in the U.S., both at university and working for American Airlines and the AMR Corporation for 10 years. At the helm of British Airways for a little more than 200 days, he was "delighted to unveil our new business plan for the next five years." Built on the concept of "changing the way we fly the world," Mr. Cruz continued by highlighting many of the changes. British Airways will change the way they care for their customers, change the way they manage their planes, change the way they take on the competition and change the way they support their own people. He also touched on the economic uncertainties caused by Brexit and the need for "the EU and the UK to agree to a comprehensive Air Transport agreement – or, in other words, Open Skies." He concluded by emphasizing the continued importance of their relationship with the U.S. and its people.



December 8, 2016 – Aviation Leaders Luncheon

Addressing the Wings Club Foundation's December meeting for the ninth consecutive year, Mr. Kelly was asked about a wide range of issues by interviewer Terry Maxon. Responding to the question on the state of the airline, Mr. Kelly exclaimed, "It is a remarkable time at Southwest...it is not just that a high tide floats all boats...it is really good times at Southwest!" He enumerated that the operations are outstanding; the employees are engaged; profits are high, boosted by low fuel costs, and they achieved record traffic for the month of November. To the comment that he would be 62 in March and that other leaders had been retiring at that age, he noted that one needs to do what is best for the family before declaring, "I have no plans to retire; no plans to work anywhere else."




