



#### **RIDING & SADDLING:**

wo people have ridden and saddled Preakness winners. Louis J. Schaefer won the 1929 Preakness aboard Dr. Freeland and in 1939, ten years later saddled Challedon to victory. John Longden duplicated the feat, winning the 1943 Preakness astride Count Fleet and saddling Majestic Prince, the victor in 1969.

# AFRICAN-AMERICAN RIDERS:

even African-American riders have had Preakness mounts, including Itwo who visited the winners' circle. George "Spider" Anderson won the 1889 Preakness aboard Buddhist. Willie Simms had two mounts, including a victory in the 1898 Preakness with Sly Fox. "Pike" Barnes was second with Philosophy in 1890, while the third and fourth place finishers in the 1896 Preakness were ridden by African-Americans (Alonzo Clayton—3rd with Intermission & Tony Hamilton—4th on Cassette). The final two to ride in the middle jewel are Wayne Barnett (Sparrowvon, 8th in 1985) and Kevin Krigger (Goldencents, 5th in 2013).

#### **BREEDING BITS:**

In all, 99 winners of the Preakness (144 races) have been bred in Kentucky. (A horse is bred where it is foaled). Next in line is Maryland with eight winners. Other winning horses were bred in Florida (seven), Virginia and Pennsylvania (six each), California (five), New Jersey (four), New York (three) and Tennessee (two) and Texas and Ohio (one each), while Canada and the United Kingdom have one winner each.

#### TRIPLE TROUBLE:

nly three Triple Crown winners - War Admiral (1937), Count Fleet (1943) and Justify (2018) - went undefeated during their 3-year-old seasons.

# MARYLAND MY MARYLAND:

he eight Maryland-breds to win the state's signature race were Cloverbrook (1877), Dunboyne (1887), Refund (1888), Sly Fox (1898), Challedon (1939), Kauai King (1966), Bee Bee Bee (1972) and Deputed Testamony (1983). Maryland-based winners include Man o' War (1920), Native Dancer (1953) and Spectacular Bid (1979).

#### **NEVER ON SUNDAY:**

Since 1931, the Preakness has been run on Saturday afternoon, although this was not always so. The Preakness has been staged on every day except Sunday. The classic has been run on Tuesday, 14 times; Friday, 13; Monday, 6; Wednesday, 5; and Thursday, 4.

#### **ORDER SWITCHED:**

n eleven occasions, the Preakness Stakes was run prior to the Kentucky Derby and twice, 1917 and 1922, both were on the same day. In 1890, the Preakness and Belmont Stakes were run on the same card at Morris Park. The Belmont has been conducted before the Preakness 11 times. Since 1931, the current order of the Derby-Preakness-Belmont has been in place with the current spacing set in 1969.



#### PREAKNESS DISTANCES:

The Preakness has been staged at seven different distances since its start in 1873:

1-1/2 miles—1873 to 1888 & 1890 1-1/4 miles—1889 1-1/16 miles—1894 to 1900 & 1908 1 mile, 70 yards—1901 to 1907 1 mile—1909 and 1910 1-1/8 miles—1911 to 1924 1-3/16 miles—1925 to present

#### FILLIES & THE PREAKNESS

Rachel Alexandra (2009) became the first filly since Nellie Morse (1924) to win the Preakness Stakes. Fifty-four fillies have competed in the Preakness with five crossing the finish line first. The others are Flocarline (1903), Whimsical (1906) and Rhine Maiden (1915). Kentucky Derby winners Genuine Risk (1980) and Winning Colors (1988) finished second and third respectively, as betting favorites.

#### **JUNE CLASSICS:**

In 1945, the Derby was conducted on June 9, followed seven days later by the Preakness. It was the only Preakness run in June in Baltimore. The Preakness was held five times in June while run in New York.

#### **GELDINGS:**

Seven geldings have won the Preakness, the last Funny Cide in 2003. The others were Prairie Bayou (1993), Holiday (1914), Buskin (1913), Layminster (1910), Don Enrique (1907) and Shirley (1876). Geldings were barred from the Preakness from 1920 through 1934.

#### **WINNING COLORS:**

ore than half of all Preakness winners have been bays, 75 of 144. Chestnut is the next popular coat, representing 48 winners. There have been 15 brown Preakness winners, two blacks and three grays. Silver Charm, the 1997 winner,

created a new category, Gray/Roan.

Native Dancer, the "Gray Ghost of Sagamore", was one of only three gray Preakness winners.



#### **ALL IN THE FAMILY:**

en Preakness winners have sired Preakness winners. They are:
Bold Ruler (Secretariat); Bold Venture (Assault); Gallant Fox (Omaha); Man o'War (War Admiral); Polynesian (Native Dancer); Citation (Fabius); Native Dancer (Kauai King), Secretariat (Risen Star), Summer Squall (Charismatic). and Exaggerator (Curlin).

#### **RECORDS:**

he current \$1.5 million dollar purse is quite a considerable difference from the first Preakness purse of \$2,050. In 1918, 26 horses were entered, causing the race to be run in two divisions for the first and only time in history.

#### **DAY'S DAYS:**

all of Fame jockey Pat Day set a record by winning the Preakness for three consecutive years. The streak started in 1994 when he rode Tabasco Cat to victory. The next year Day guided Timber Country to the winners' circle and in '96 was aboard Louis Quatorze. Day's five Preakness victories are second on the all-time list behind fellow Hall of Famer Eddie Arcaro.

#### **ARCARO'S ARTISTRY:**

thas been 61 years since Eddie Arcaro recorded his sixth and final Preakness winner aboard Bold Ruler in 1957. Arcaro, who still retains the all-time Preakness record for winners, participated in the Preakness a final time in 1959, finishing ninth with First Landing. In all, he made 15 appearances in the Classic, starting with a 7th place finish on Nellie Flag in 1935. Arcaro hit his first Preakness jackpot with Whirlaway in 1941 and then scored with Citation in 1948, both Triple Crown winners. His other four trips to the winners' circle were aboard Hill Prince (1950), Bold (1951), Nashua (1955) and Bold Ruler (1957).





#### WALDEN, BAFFERT TOP TRAINERS:

obert Wyndham Walden, of Bowling Brook Farm in Middleburg, Md., was perhaps the most celebrated trainer of his day. During the final quarter of the 19th century he saddled seven Preakness winners, including five straight from 1878 to 1882. George Lorillard, widely known as a yachtsman, outdoorsman and a prominent Thoroughbred owner, owned all five.

Justify in 2018 enabled fellow Hall of Famer Bob Baffert to join Walden with a seventh Preakness victory before going on to sweep the Triple Crown. Baffert's other Preakness winners came with 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, Lookin At Lucky (2010), War Emblem (2002), Point Given (2001), Real Quiet (1998) and Silver Charm (1997).

#### **CALUMET LEADS OWNERS & BREEDERS:**

alumet Farm, the leading Preakness owner with eight wins, was one of the great dynasties in Thoroughbred history.
Founded by Warren Wright and successfully carried on by his widow, Lucille, and her husband Admiral Gene Markey, Calumet Farm turned out champion after champion from its Lexington, Ky. Farm.

Calumet owned and bred Preakness winners Whirlaway (1941), Pensive (1944), Faultless (1947), Citation (1948), Fabius (1956), Tim Tam (1958) and Forward Pass (1968).

Calumet was sold by auction to Henry de Kwiatkowski for \$17 million on March 26, 1992.

In May 2012, the de Kwiatkowski heirs sold the farm to Brad Kelley for a reported \$40 million. A year later Oxbow gave Calumet its eighth Preakness victory.

#### MAIDENS IN THE PREAKNESS:

hen Laoban entered the 2016 Preakness, he was attempting to become the first maiden to win the Preakness since 1888. According to Allan Carter, historian at the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame, the Preakness was won six times by maidens prior to 1900. They were: Survivor (1873), Culpepper (1874), Shirley (1876), Cloverbrook (1877), Saunterer (1881), and Refund (1888).

## PREAKNESS INFIELDFEST

The Maryland Jockey Club has turned Preakness InfieldFest into one of the East Coast's biggest parties with a weekend of eclectic music from the world's biggest acts.

Through Preakness Week, fans from around the world file into Pimlico Race Course and Baltimore to attend a number of events culminating in InfieldFest on Preakness Day.

InfieldFest has showcased many of music's biggest stars, including Sam Hunt, Zedd and Good Charlotte (2017); The Chainsmokers and Fetty Wap (2016); Armin van Buuren and Childish Gambino (2015); Lorde and NAS (2014); Macklemore & Ryan Lewis, Pitbull and Florida Georgia Line (2013); Maroon 5 and Wiz Khalifa (2012); Bruno Mars (2011); Zac Brown, O.A.R. and Train (2010); and Buckcherry and ZZTop (2009).

In addition to the main stage, Preakness InfieldFest features live music from top acts on a second stage, presented

by Jagermeister as well as a variety of other activities. The Jagermeister stage acts and the other main stage performers are announced in the weeks leading up to the Preakness. The music festival at InfieldFest on Preakness Day and numerous events on Black-Eyed Susan Day help comprise Preakness Week at Pimlico.

"Preakness InfieldFest continues to grow as a major music and entertainment festival," said Maryland Jockey Club President and General Manager Sal Sinatra.

Multi-platinum recording artist Post Malone and two-time Grammy Award-nominated electronic duo ODESZA headlined an incredible lineup of acclaimed artists at InfieldFest 2018. Also playing to another excited packed house were Vice, two of the hottest DJs in music; Frank Walker and rapper 21 Savage.

## THE PREAKNESS STAKES

n a late summer evening in 1868, an agreement among sportsmen to stage a special race to commemorate a memorable occasion became the foundation for the middle jewel of racing's Triple Crown, the Preakness Stakes. Governor Oden Bowie of Maryland, a horseman and racing entrepreneur, was among the distinguished roster of guests at an elegant dinner party after the races at the Grand Union Hotel in Saratoga given by Milton H. Sanford, who had gained much of his wealth selling blankets during the Civil War. John Hunter of New York proposed that the feast be commemorated by a stakes race to be run in the fall of 1870 for three-year old colts and fillies at two miles, to be known as the Dinner Party

Stakes in honor of the evening. Bowie electrified the gathering by suggesting a purse of \$15,000, a staggering sum in those days.

Governor Bowie requested that the Dinner Party Stakes be run in Maryland and pledged to build a new racetrack to host it. Hence, the idea for Pimlico Race Course was born, and in the fall of 1870, the inaugural Dinner Party Stakes was run on



Pimlico's opening. Won by Sanford's Preakness, one of only two male entrants in the seven horse field, the massive bay colt was a first time starter. His jockey, Billy Hayward, followed a unique tradition of the day after the race: a wire was stretched across the track from the judges' stand with a small silk bag filled with gold pieces. When the race was over, the winning jockey untied the string holding the bag and claimed the money. It is believed this custom brought about the modern day "wire" at the finish line, and the designation of "purse" money.

Bowie's Dinner Party Stakes would later be run at Pimlico as the Dixie Handicap (now known as the "Dixie"), and hold the honor of being the 8th oldest stakes race in America.

Two years before the Kentucky Derby would appear, Pimlico was busy introducing its new stakes race for three-year olds, the Preakness, during its first-ever spring race meet in 1873. Governor Bowie had named the mile and one-half race in honor of the first Dinner Party Stakes winner, Preakness.

The scene was set for the first Preakness Stakes on Tuesday, May 23, a warm and muggy spring day at Pimlico. The crowd, well aware of Bowie's accomplishments in putting Baltimore on the national Thoroughbred map, swelled to 12,000. The violet-painted stands and the Victorian Clubhouse, which survived until a fire destroyed it in 1966, were deco-

rated with the Maryland Jockey Club blue and white pennants. Entertainment was provided by Itzel's Fifth Regiment Band, which played operatic arias from Martha and Il Trovatore, and popular tunes of the day.

The first Preakness drew seven starters, but it was John Chamberlain's three-year old, Survivor, who galloped home easily by ten lengths, to this day the second largest Preakness margin of victory and a purse of \$2,050.

The new Preakness, off to a great start, prospered for the next 17 years. The early Preakness Stakes attracted quality horses and good crowds; however, in 1889, due to changes in the racing industry, the Preakness and Pimlico galloped to

a halt. In 1890, the Preakness was run at Morris Park in New York. The Maryland Jockey Club continued to be involved in racing by presenting some steeplechasing and even trotting races at Pimlico, but the Preakness did not return home to Pimlico until 1909. During this interval, the Preakness was run for 15 years at the Gravesend track in Brooklyn, New York. These 15 so-called "lost"

Preaknesses were officially enrolled in the race history of the classic in 1948; the 1890 Preakness was added in the 1960's.

Several traditions enjoyed today are attributed to the spontaneity of the 1909 Preakness renewal. For example, the musical rendering of "Maryland My Maryland" began when a bugler, moved by the spirit of the day, began playing Maryland's historic state song. The rest of the band, inspired by the music, joined in and the crowd reacted enthusiastically. In addition, Preakness 1909 also inaugurated the concept of the "painting of the colors" atop the weather vane, to honor the winning horse.

From that day in 1909, the Preakness has run without a break each year at Pimlico, steadily growing in popularity and purse value. It was once said that having the Preakness in Baltimore is like being able to schedule the World Series or Super Bowl every year. The Preakness Stakes has remained throughout history a true test of a horse's ability and class, a race where remarkable horses meet one another other in a great classic.

The phrase "Triple Crown" was not coined until the 1930's, but it is this race on the third Saturday in May where the best of the Derby horses gather to see if there will be that window of opportunity for a Triple Crown prospect. Much goes on during this colorful time at Pimlico, but it has always been the horse that draws the fans. As poet Ogden Nash wrote: "The Derby is a race of aristocratic sleekness, for horses of birth to prove their worth to run in the Preakness."



## PREAKNESS—"WHAT'S IN A NAME?"

at all started with the Minisi, a northern New Jersey tribe of native Americans. They called their area Pra-qua-les, meaning quail woods. After a series of spellings the name eventually evolved into Preakness.

One of its variations was Preckiness, used by General George Washington to describe the area where his troops were quartered in the winter of 1776–77. Nearly a century later, Milton H. Sanford, a Thoroughbred owner, became attracted to the name. He called his farms, one in New Jersey and another in Kentucky, Preakness. His Jersey farm was located in the Indians' "quail woods." Today, there remains a Preakness, N.J.

When he bought a yearling sired by Lexington and out of Bay Leaf from A. J. Alexander, he named the colt (bred in Kentucky at Woodburn Farm) Preakness, unaware that he was contributing to turf immortality. Preakness, the eighth foal of Bay Leaf, cost Sanford \$2,000.

It was Preakness who turned up as a 3-year-old for his debut in the Dinner Party Stakes at Pimlico's inaugural in 1870. He was derided as a "cart horse" for his ungainly appearance, but won that first stakes at Old Hilltop, which became a history-producing victory.

In his triumph, Preakness was ridden by English jockey Billy Hayward, who supplied the name for one of Pimlico's present adjoining streets. It was the colt's only start in 1870 but left a lasting impression at Pimlico. Three years later, the Maryland Jockey Club honored him by calling its newest stakes race "Preakness." The Dinner Party Stakes eventually became the present-day Dixie.

Preakness continued to race through his eight-year-old season in America. He won the Baltimore Cup, carrying 131 pounds at age eight and also finished in a deadheat with Springbok in the 1875 Saratoga Cup at 2 1/4 miles.

Later that year, Sanford sent Preakness to England. He became one of the first American horses to be given genuine recognition by the British. Eventually the Duke of Hamilton purchased Preakness from Sanford for breeding.

As Preakness grew older, he developed a temper and was tough to handle. Apparently the Duke of Hamilton's disposition was not smooth either. One day in a fit of rage, he shot and killed Preakness, touching off a reform in English laws which governed the handling of animals.

## THE MOST VALUABLE TROPHY IN AMERICAN SPORTS

The elegant Woodlawn Vase, originally created by Tiffany and Company in 1860 as a trophy for the now defunct Woodlawn Racing Association in Louisville, is presented annually to the Preakness winner.

The beautiful silver design assessed in 1983 for \$1 million, is easily the most valuable trophy in American sports.

Standing 34 inches tall and weighing 29 pounds, 12 ounces, the Woodlawn Vase has a colorful history as rich as the classic race at which it is presented. It has been raced for in Louisville, Elizabeth, N.J., the Coney Island Jockey Club, Jerome Park, Morris Park, and since 1917, at Pimlico Race Course. Created as a challenge cup, the Woodlawn Vase was first won by Capt. T. G. Moore's mare, Mollie Jackson, in 1861. The same owner retained possession the following year through the victory of the famous mare Idlewind. The outbreak of the Civil War prevented further competition until 1866. The vase in the meantime was buried at Woodlawn with others of the Moore family plate, lest it be discovered and melted into shot.

Following the war, the vase remained in Kentucky until 1878, when the Dwyer brothers captured it by the aid of Bramble and Jimmy McLaughlin in the American Stallion Stakes at Churchill Downs, Louisville.

The Dwyer Brothers presented the vase to the Coney Island Jockey Club, where notable stables of the day competed vigorously for the vase for several years.

Later, it was twice competed for in 1894 at Jerome Park, and then at Morris Park in 1901 and 1902.

Thomas C. Clyde, owner of Goughacres Stable, won possession through the double victory of his homebred colt Shorthose in 1903 and 1904. Shorthose was the only horse — with the exception of the wonderful Miss Woodford — to win it twice.

In 1917, Mr. Clyde presented the vase to the Maryland Jockey Club, where he was a director. It was added to the Preakness that year, though Clyde proposed a condition — the winning owner should keep the vase for the year, and have the privilege of naming the course and the stake for its renewal. Edward R. Bradley's Kalitan was the first winner of the vase at Pimlico.

The vase was presented to the winning Preakness owner each year — although the latter part of Clyde's condition did not prevail — until 1953, when Alfred G. Vanderbilt's Native Dancer won it. Due to the

historic value of the legendary trophy, Mrs. Vanderbilt preferred not to accept responsibility for the vase's safekeeping until the next year's Preakness.

A smaller sterling silver replica, valued at \$30,000, requires twelve weeks of a silversmith's hand tooling by Kirk Stieff, a division of Lenox. It is awarded to the winning owner of the Preakness Stakes on a permanent basis. The perpetual is on display at The Baltimore Museum of Art and is brought to Pimlico Race Course under guard for the annual running of the Preakness.

The following is an excerpt from Wilkes Spirit of The Times, The American Gentleman's Newspaper 1867:

"Messrs. Tiffany & Co., the celebrated jewelers, on Tuesday last sent to Louisville, KY a massive silver vase, for the Woodlawn Race Course Association, one of the most elegant of the kind ever made in this city. Its entire height is 36 inches, its weight is four hundred ounces, and its value \$1,500. The base of this piece is a circle thirteen inches in diameter, supported upon a cross, then four projections of which are faced each with a race shoe; and on the top of each projection is a racing saddle, whip, jockey cap, etc. The upper part of the base represents a lawn, divided into fields by a rustic fence. In one field is seen a stallion and in the other a mare and foal. On either side of the pillar is a bulletin, on which the rules to be observed in contending for the prize are distinctly engraved. The centerpiece, or bowl, is fourteen inches above the base, and fourteen inches in diameter,

and has four shields. On one of these is engraved the picture of a race horse, on another a representations of the Woodlawn Race Course, on another is a blank for the history of the winning of the prize, and the other also blank for a portrait of the winner. Between the shields are four figures of Victory, in frosted silver, each holding a wreath in either hand. Seven inches above the bowl is a circular ornament nine inches in diameter, having engraved on it the portraits of eight

ornament nine inches in diameter, having engraved on it the portraits of eight officers of the Woodlawn Race Course Association. The whole is surmounted by a full figure of the horse "Lexington", mounted by a jockey in costume. The rules under which this prize is to be contended for are such that a man who wins it on the first trial (which is to occur on Saturday, the 18th instant) is to give bonds to produce the Vase for future trials; and no one is entitled to it without giving

such bonds, until be has won it three successive times. There are four challengers for the Vase, who name their horses to the post.We hope to

bear the result in time for our next paper."



## **CUPOLA WEATHER VANE: A PIMLICO TRADITION**

The Preakness requires a painter, tints of all colors and a ladder on a hydraulic lift to complete an annual tradition shortly after the horses cross the finish line.

As soon as the Preakness winner has been declared official, a painter lifts himself to the top of a replica of the Old Clubhouse cupola. He applies the colors of the victorious owner's silks on the jockey and numbers the horse's saddlecloth, which are part of the weather vane atop the infield structure. The paint job remains until the next year's Preakness.

The practice started in 1909 at Pimlico when a horse and rider weather vane sat at the top of the old Members' Clubhouse, which was constructed upon Pimlico's opening in 1870. The Victorian building was destroyed by fire in June of 1966. A replica of the old building's cupola was built to stand in the Preakness winners' circle in the infield.

Originally, the ancient building had an arrow-shaped weather vane, but in 1909 it was struck down by lightning. To replace it, the Maryland Jockey Club commissioned an ornamental ironworker to forge a vane in the form of a horse and rider. It was christened that spring by coating with the colors of the silks borne by Effendi, winner of the 1909 Preakness.

The jockey on Effendi was Willie Doyle, who later served as one of the best racing officials in America and whose ashes, upon his death at the age of 67 in 1950, were spread across the finish line of the track where he scored his most famous victory.

In 1918, when the Preakness was run in two divisions, Jack Hare Jr. winning one end and War Cloud the other, the winning colors were changed after the first six months to give the victors equal time in the year on the weather vane.

When the old Members' Clubhouse burned down the only thing saved from the ruins was the iron weather vane. It is currently on display at Pimlico's museum exhibit, "Hoofbeats Through History."

In recent years, Tommy Ennis, a Charles Town, WV sign painter, had the honor of applying the winning colors of the five-foot wide aluminum model of horse and rider weather vane on the replica of the old clubhouse. Ennis retired in 1987. Michael Willinger of Sykesville, MD took over the job for the 1987 Preakness. Lawrence Jones, who lives in the Pimlico neighborhood, has the job now.

When Willinger had the assignment to paint the new colors on the weather vane, he commented: "It is just the thrill of being able to participate in a big local and national event like this. Let's face it, it's the only televised sign painting job in the country."

In 2000, Jones was joined by a special partner to carry

out the tradition following Preakness 125. Renowned artist LeRoy Neiman applied the winning colors along with Jones following the classic race.

#### THE HOUSE OF STYLE

From 1870 through 1966, a fashionable segment of racing fans would not consider being anywhere else on Preakness day than the sprawling, comfortable Victorian building affectionately known as the Old Clubhouse.

Painted yellow with white trim and green shutters, the Old Clubhouse stood for 96 years as a sentinel at the foot of the homestretch.

Lamentably, an entire generation has grown up without ever having known the wooden structure that was cruelly destroyed like kindling in a fireplace on a night in June, 1966. Erased in a few minutes was a deeply ingrained Maryland racing tradition, decades of memories, racing heirlooms, genteel customs. A way of life was rudely evaporated.

In its heyday, the Old Clubhouse represented an aspect of Thoroughbred racing that present-day racing fans would find difficult to envision. For members of the Maryland Jockey Club there was no need for a dress code. The height of fashion attire was assumed there. The clientele—gentlemen in business suits or tweed sports coats and ladies impeccably costumed up to their hats—were served in the main dining room by white-coated Harry M. Stevens waiters, directed by a maitre d' wearing a tuxedo. Elegance prevailed, and the menu was on a par with the atmosphere.

The Old Clubhouse, entered on the ground level, opened to a beautiful wide staircase, which led to the main floor containing the dining room and numerous sitting rooms, all with gleaming wood floors. A wrap-around porch, a favorite spot to watch the races, encased most of the second floor.


The third floor, beneath the ornate cupola topped by a horse and rider weather vane, contained a number of rooms. In the earlier days, these rooms were assigned to trainers of prominent stables during the two-week spring and fall meetings. When the building was refurbished in the mid-1950's, these rooms were converted to dining areas and a beautifully restored library and reading

room. Unfortunately, a number of irreplaceable racing books, photographs and paintings were lost in the fire.

For luncheon on Preakness day, reservations were required months in advance and space—including tables on the lawn—was at a premium. For one of the porch tables, no reservation was ever available. It was assumed that William Woodward, Sr., of Belair Stud and Gallant Fox and Omaha fame, would appear to dine and view the Preakness every year.

A present-day Preakness tradition, the Alibi Breakfast, which seems to grow larger every year, was founded in the Old Clubhouse. The late Vaughn Flannery, an artist who painted many scenes of Pimlico, is credited with proposing the Alibi Table in the Clubhouse. The table was set up early each morning during race meetings, by order of Joe Stevens, Sr. Trainers, racing officials and other guests dropped by during training hours for coffee and a food snack, and swapped racing stories. Many tales involved details of losing bets, hence the name—Alibi Table. Attendance grew over the years. Now 500 or more have breakfast at Pimlico on the Thursday morning before the Preakness.

A token remembrance of the Old Clubhouse remains at Pimlico. A replica of the destroyed building's cupola sits in the infield, complete with horse and jockey weather vane. Just as in days of old, the colors of the winning owner in the Preakness are painted on the rider, immediately following the running of the race.




#### **BLACK-EYED SUSAN BLANKET**

t remains a long-standing tradition to present the winner of the Preakness a blanket of Black-Eyed Susans, which is draped across the shoulders of the winning horse. Colonel Edward R. Bradley's Bimelech in 1940 was the first winner to wear the floral blanket of Black-Eyed Susans. Construction of the blanket has varied in method from a loosely intertwined garland of flowers tied with hemp rope, to the current blanket type of presentation.

The Black-Eyed Susan blanket is created shortly before Preakness Day. It takes about eight hours for four people to make the blanket. The first step is to cut out a piece of black matting and a piece of green felt into the form of a blanket. The matting is spread out and Ruscus is placed on top. Two people are assigned the duty of cutting Viking Poms about an inch from the flower and inserting a wire into the stem. The second pair of workers attach each flower through the matting by poking a wire through the flower to secure it

into position. This process is repeated 4,000 times until the matting is completely covered. Then the green felt is sewn by hand to the back of the matting so that the wires are protected from touching the horse and so that the blanket will lay softly on the winner's withers.

The blanket is 18 inches wide and 90 inches in length. Upon completion, the center of the daisies are daubed with black lacquer to recreate the appearance of a Black-Eyed Susan. The blanket is then sprayed with water and refrigerated until Preakness Day, when it is delivered to the track, to be worn by the Preakness winner. Black-Eyed Susans, declared the state flower by the Maryland legislature in 1918 and the Preakness flower in 1940, do not bloom until June in Maryland. It is said the Susan's flower usually has 13 petals, which is taken to symbolize the 13 original colonies, of which Maryland was one. The flower reproduces the state's black and yellow colors.

## PREAKNESS HISTORY

#### ALIBI BREAKFAST

It started with a cup of coffee. In the late 1930s on the porch of the historical Pimlico Clubhouse, a group of trainers, owners and greater and lesser dignitaries would gather in the mornings to expound upon the merits of their horses.

The group would meet at the first training period starting at 6:00 a.m. and disperse when training ended at 10:00 a.m. Notable trainers such as Yancey Christmas and Horatio Luro would swap information with other gentlemen in the morning, offering no alibis, but telling some of the best racing stories to ever reach print. The veracity of some of these tales, however, was questionable. Conflicting information as

to the condition of the horse, jockey, track and even trainer were combined into tales of half-truth and half-fiction.

Today's Alibi Breakfast is a descendant of the original gathering at the Old Clubhouse. Named in the 1940s by publicity director David Woods, today's Alibi Breakfast features a gathering of media, owners, trainers, jockeys and horsemen to celebrate Preakness, and solicit interesting race predictions.

The Alibi Breakfast has also become an opportunity for the Maryland Jockey Club to recognize those who have made significant contributions to the racing industry.

#### **SECRETARIAT**

The Maryland Racing Commission voted June 9, 2012 in a special hearing at Laurel Park that 1973 Triple Crown winner Secretariat, who set records that still stand at the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont Stakes, also set the record in the Preakness Stakes at Pimlico Race Course.

In a unanimous 7-0 decision, the official time of the 1973 Preakness was changed from 1:54 2/5 to 1:53. Secretariat is one of 13 thoroughbreds to win the Triple Crown, with victories in the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont as a 3-year-old.

"I didn't know if it was appropriate to cheer but I couldn't help myself," said Secretariat's owner Penny Chenery.

For more than two hours, the racing commission heard testimony, backed by modern technology to prove Secretariat's time was actually faster than the Preakness record of 1:53 2/5, set by Tank's Prospect in 1985 and matched by Louis Quatorze (1996) and Curlin (2007).

"Justice was served," Pimlico president Tom Chuckas said. "The Secretariat team made a compelling case that he ran the race in 1:53 flat and added the Preakness record to his resume. This is terrific news for Mrs. Chenery, who has been diligent in her fight for nearly 40 years, and the entire

sport of horse racing."

The electronic timer in use at Pimlico for the 1973 Preakness recorded a winning time of 1:55—a clocking that quickly became the source of controversy after two independent clockers from the Daily Racing Form had individually hand-timed the race at a much faster 1:53 2/5. In the days following race, the Maryland Racing Commission stewards and later the racing commission concluded that there were "extenuating circumstances" attendant to the electronic timer's recording. As a result, the official time was subsequently changed to that reported by Pimlico's official hand clocker – 1:54 2/5.

"It is wonderful for the sport to remove an asterisk and wonderful for the legacy of Secretariat and his fans, who believed he set the record in all three Triple Crown races," said Leonard Lusky, who represented Chenery at the hearing. "This was a labor of love and it was so important because it was Secretariat and the Preakness, one of the landmark events in horse racing."

The track record for 1 3/16 mile distance at Pimlico is still held by Farma Way with a time of 1:52 2/5 in the 1991 Pimlico Special.

#### VALUE OF THE PREAKNESS

In December 2013, the Maryland Jockey Club announced it has increased the purse for the Preakness Stakes (G1) from \$1 million to \$1.5 million.

It is the first increase for the 1 3/16-mile classic since the purse was raised to \$1 million guaranteed in 1998. Throughout the years, the Preakness purse has been among the highest in American racing.

At its inauguration in 1873, the Preakness carried a value of \$1,000. The first major increase occurred in 1919 when the race had a \$25,000 value. It climbed to \$100,000 in 1946 and in 1959 was raised to \$150,000, the highest among Triple Crown races.

From 1979 to 1989, the purse rose four times from \$200,000 to \$500,000, before attaining million dollar status.

## 73 FAVORITES HAVE WON THE PREAKNESS



Spectacular Bid, 1979

In 144 races (the Preakness was run in two divisions in 1918), 73 winners have left the post as betting choices.

Since 1911, when parimutuel wagering made its first appearance at Pimlico, 28 Preakness favorites have started at odds of less than even money. Eighteen have won, 10 paid .50 to 1.00 or less. They were:

#### FILLIES IN PREAKNESS

Rachel Alexandra (2009) became the first filly since Nellie Morse (1924) to win the Preakness Stakes. Fifty-four fillies have competed in the Preakness with five crossing the line first. The others are Flocarline (1903), Whimsical (1906) and Rhine Maiden (1915). Only once in Triple Crown history have two different fillies won both the Derby and Preakness in the same year. Regret became the first filly to take the Derby on May 8, 1915 and though it is not as well known, nine days later Rhine Maiden captured the Preakness. Regret did not compete.

When Genuine Risk ran in the 1980 Preakness she became the 50th filly to start in the race since 1873 but the first of her sex to compete in all three of the Triple Crown races. Genuine Risk compiled the best record for a filly in the Triple Crown, winning the Derby and running second in the Preakness and Belmont Stakes. Eight years later in 1988, Winning Colors, the Derby winner and 51st filly in the Preakness also ran in all Triple Crown events. Besides Genuine Risk and Winning Colors, only two other fillies have competed in more than one of the Classics, Careful in 1921 and Nellie Flag in 1935.

## WHERE PREAKNESS **WINNERS PREPPED**

ince Calumet Farm's Whirlaway won the 1941 Preakness en route to becoming racing's fifth Triple Crown champion, almost half of the Preakness winners have spent the opening months of their three-year-old campaigns racing in Florida.

Thirty-five of the past 74 Preakness winners raced in Florida preceding their assaults on the Triple Crown, while 22 prepped in California. Eight colts which won the Preakness since 1941 did not race over the winter but were bedded down at training farms. Two of these—Count Fleet and Assault—went on to win the Triple Crown. Man O'War's first race in 1920 was in the Preakness.

#### SIRES OF PREAKNESS WINNERS

exington was an American phenomenon as a stallion. He reigned as the nation's premier sire from 1861 to 1874 and again in 1876 and 1878. Lexington sired three Preakness winners—Tom Ochiltree (1875); Shirley (1876) and the Duke of Magenta (1878). His three Preakness winners tie him with Broomstick. After a great racing career Broomstick became a distinguished stallion. Broomstick's three Preakness victors were Holiday (1914); Broomspun (1921) and Bostonian (1927).

Nine Preakness winners have sired Preakness winners. They are Bold Ruler (Secretariat), Bold Venture (Assault), Gallant Fox (Omaha), Man O'War (War Admiral), Polynesian (Native Dancer), Citation (Fabius), Native Dancer (Kauai King), Secretariat (Risen Star), Summer Squall (Charismatic), and Curlin (Exaggerator).

## SUPPLEMENTARY NOMINATIONS

the first provision for supplementary nominations to the Preakness was made in 1938. In the years since, conditions for supplementary entries have varied. Until 1985, it was possible to supplement a horse for the Preakness by the payment of a \$20,000 fee on the Thursday preceding the running, the usual time of closing entries. In 1986, supplemental nominations were eliminated. In 1991 supplemental nominations were revived and a 3-year-old may be supplemented for the Preakness by the payment of a \$100,000 fee prior to the draw.

In 2009, the new connections of Rachel Alexandra paid a \$100,000 supplemental fee to enter into the Preakness and then watched her become the first filly in 85 years to win the Preakness.

In 1975, Master Derby paid the highest win price ever (\$48.80) and became the first supplementary Preakness winner in 25 years. In 1950, Christopher T. Chenery's Hill Prince was the victor, made eligible by payment of a \$1,500 fee on April 18.

Earlier, Warren Wright had made both Citation and Coaltown supplementaries (\$3,000 each, April 15) for the 1948 Preakness. Citation, however, was Calumet's only starter that year.

## PREAKNESS WINNERS: HORSE OF THE YEAR

The most cherished accolade in racing is Horse of the Year. Since 1937, the honor has been bestowed on 21 Preakness winners the year they won the classic. Since 1971, voting has been conducted by the National Turf Writers Association, the Thoroughbred Racing Association, and the Daily Racing Form.

## PREAKNESS WINNERS DOMINATE 3-YEAR-OLD ECLIPSE AWARD

eginning with Silver Charm in 1997, 16 of the last 22 Preakness Stakes winners have been named Champion 3-year-old Male at the annual Eclipse Awards. The 13 other Preakness Stakes winners to be named 3-year-old champion are: Real Quiet (1998); Charismatic (1999); Point Given (2001); War Emblem (2002); Funny Cide (2003); Smarty Jones (2004); Afleet Alex (2005); Bernardini (2006); Curlin (2007); Big Brown (2008); Lookin At Lucky (2010); I'll Have Another (2012); California Chrome (2014), American Pharoah (2015) and Justify (2018).

The 2000 3-year-old Champion, Tiznow, did not compete in the Preakness. Shackleford (2011) and Exaggerator (2016) were finalists for top 3-year-old honors. Neither Oxbow (2013) nor Cloud Computing (2017) were included in the three finalists for the award for their respective classses.

Rachel Alexandra (2009) became the first filly since Nellie Morse (1924) to win the Preakness Stakes. She captured Horse of the Year and Champion 3-year-old Filly honors. She became the 18th Preakness winner to earn Horse of the Year. Time Magazine ranked Rachel's Preakness victory as the fifth-best sports moment of the year.



I'll Have Another was the 45th Preakness winner to earn the title of Champion 3-year-old Male.



CLOUD COMPUTING drafted in towards the rail nearing the wire the first time and tracked firmly in hand, eased out and was put to pressure mid way on the final turn, brushed with ALWAYS DREAMING soon into the lane, came in briefly when put to the right stick three sixteenths from home, corrected and responded when roused once left handed, closed in under solid hand encouragement and collared CLASSIC EMPIRE a sixteenth out, assumed a short lead with about fifty yards to go and held firm. CLASSIC EMPIRE bobbled slightly at the break but quickly recovered and was sent to engage ALWAYS DREAMING from his outside, prompted in hand, disposed of that rival and went clear near the five sixteenths, was under strong encouragement into the lane, dug in gamely through the final sixteenth but just could not deny the winner. SENIOR INVESTMENT, fractious in the saddling area, settled well off the early pace and off the inside, steadied briefly near the far turn, angled out and circled six wide into the lane, straightened and kept on willingly to gain the show. LOOKIN AT LEE leaned in causing an awkward break, dropped in early and lagged well back, was under pressure three wide near the far turn, angled five wide for the drive and kept trying to the wire. GUNNEVERA saved ground under urging, gained into the lane, worked through a bit of a tight spot when angling closer to the rail near the three sixteenths, pursued the top pair past the furlong grounds then flattened out. MULTIPLIER was unhurried while saving ground, gained along the fence near the quarter pole, angled out soon after, lost a bit of momentum nearing the eighth pole, regrouped and churned on between rivals. CONQUEST MO MONEY, three to four wide under coaxing, commenced a run leaving the far turn, continued steady progress under a drive to upper stretch, failed to sustain leaving the three sixteenths, drifted in briefly and faded. ALWAYS DRE AMING brushed the outside of the gate and had his rider briefly adjust his right iron, straightened, secured the rail and was hounded by CLASSIC EMPIRE, could not go with that rival leaving the three eighths, shifted out chasing into the lane, brushed with the winner then gave way. HENCE, off the pace two to three wide, was under strong urging leaving the far turn but failed to respond. TERM OF ART was sent from the gate to gain a forward spot, chased the leaders three wide, could not keep pace nearing the five sixteenths and gave way.

JUSTIFY got engaged in a duel outside of GOOD MAGIC soon after the start, jumped tracks under the wire the first time, went head to head while about four wide through the backstretch run, came under some coaxing as the pace picked up leaving the three eighths pole, emerged from the fog past mid stretch with a slim lead and under solid left handed encouragement, nearly moved clear with about seventy yards to go then prevailed under steady handling. BRAVAZO, four wide early while in close attendance of the duel, dropped in a path and chased to the inside of TENFOLD near the five sixteenths, altered out to the center of the track in upper stretch, straightened and closed sharply to rapidly gain. TENFOLD, about four wide into the first turn, exchanged a bump with DIAMOND KING near the seven eighths marker, commenced a four wide run while under urging leaving the far turn, closed on his left lead while between rivals in deep stretch but wasn't quite good enough. GOOD MAGIC hooked up to the inside of the winner in the opening sixteenth, sparred under rating while removed from rail, kept up the fight to the sixteenth marker then gave way grudgingly. LONE SAILOR angled out and settled well off the early pace, moved up some while about four wide nearing the half mile pole, dropped in a bit and chased under pressure past the five sixteenths, came back out in deep stretch and churned on. SPORTING CHANCE, between foes early, checked when in close entering the first turn, recovered to rate about two to three wide, angled out leaving the five sixteenths but lacked a rally. DIAMOND KING, between runners early, bumped with TENFOLD near the seven eighths, made a bit of a run off the rail into the far turn, lacked a further response and faded. QUIP bobbled soon after the break, was taken to rate while saving ground, continued inside into the far turn and faltered. Due to dense fog, the stretch call was made slightly past the eighth pole. 

After winning the 1998 Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes®, Real Quiet missed his Triple Crown by the narrowest of margins as Victory Gallop caught him at the Belmont wire to win by a nose.















There were 37 years of frustration and disappointment erased in 2015 when American Pharoah became the first horse since Affirmed in 1978 to win the Triple Crown, a feat repeated by Justify in 2018.

The bay colt's victory under a charcoal sky and driving rain in the 140th Preakness, the middle jewel of the Triple Crown, was spectacular, paving the way for his coronation in the Belmont Stakes to become racing's 12th Triple Crown winner.

While American Pharoah and Justify proved the Triple Crown could still be won, it did not didn't diminish the enormity of winning sport's most elusive prize. Consider it had been 37 years between Affirmed and American Pharoah's Triple Crowns, the longest drought since Citation (1948) and Secretariat (1973). Before American Pharoah, 18 horses had gone to New York with a chance of winning the Triple Crown, only to falter in the "Test of a Champion."

The intriguing series of spring races is over 125 years old with the prize becoming available in 1875, with the first running of the Kentucky Derby, the last of the Triple Crown events to be introduced. The Preakness dates back to 1873, while the Belmont Stakes began in 1867.

### A Genuine Iron Horse

Sir Barton, a foal of 1916 bred by Preston Madden, was born too soon. He was never hailed as a Triple Crown winner because the feat had not been named when he swept the Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes in 1919. "Triple Crown" began appearing in print about 1936, far too late for Sir Barton.

Commander J. K. L. Ross, who owned a farm in Maryland where the former Freestate harness track was located, purchased Sir Barton for \$10,000 as a 2-year-old at Saratoga. Ross had an outstanding 3-year-old prospect in 1919 — Billy Kelly — but Sir Barton, his stablemate, who had never won a race, was started in the Derby as part of the Ross entry.

Sir Barton broke on top in the Derby and never looked back. Perhaps more amazing, Sir Barton was immediately shipped to Pimlico because that year the Maryland classic was run on Wednesday, just four days after the Derby. Once again the unheralded Sir Barton galloped home by four lengths in a display of stamina. In the Belmont, he set an American record of 2:17% for the mile and three-eighths, the distance then.

### Fox of Belair

Gallant Fox was bred and raced by William Woodward.

The son of Sir Gallahad III had a medicore 2-year-old season winning but two stakes. It was hardly an indication of his 3-year-old superiority. After capturing the Wood Memorial, Gallant Fox swept the Preakness, Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes in that order. He is the only Triple Crown winner to win the Preakness a week before the Derby.

Later as a 3-year-old he captured the Dwyer Stakes, Arlington Classic, Saratoga Cup, Lawrence Realization and the Jockey Club Gold Cup. The "Fox of Belair" was retired for breeding after his 3-year-old campaign, which netted \$308,275, a single season record then.

Gallant Fox sired the winners of more than ninety races before his death in 1954 at the age of 27. His most famous son was Omaha, the 1935 Triple Crown winner. Omaha enabled him to become the only Triple Crown winner to sire a victor in the renowned Derby, Preakness, Belmont series.

### Like Father, Like Son

Omaha was born in Kentucky in 1932, just two years after his sire, Gallant Fox, had won the Triple Crown. As a weanling, he was sent to Belair in Maryland where he was broken as a yearling and turned over to trainer Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons.

The William Woodward owned and bred colt, like his sire, was not overly impressive at two but improved with age. After a third in the Wood Memorial, he set sail for the Triple Crown. Nellie Flag, a filly, was favored in the Derby but Omaha rallied and won by a length and a half. The Preakness was more of a romp as he won by six lengths. He became the third Triple Crown winner with a length and a half victory in the Belmont.

Omaha is the only Triple Crown winner to race abroad. Woodward sent him to England at four. After taking two secondary stakes, Omaha just missed winning the Ascot Gold Cup.

### War Admiral

### Little Admiral

War Admiral was a smaller copy of his illustrious sire, Man O' War. Although he stood only 15.2 hands, War Admiral was Man O' War's best offspring. Owned and bred by Sam Riddle, who raced Man O' War, War Admiral reached his peak as a 3-year-old after a so-so 2-year-old season.

At three, War Admiral, who prepped in Maryland for the Triple Crown, recorded a perfect eight-for-eight year.

In the Derby, War Admiral led from flag to finish, but the Preakness produced one of the most memorable battles in Triple Crown history. Pompoon and War Admiral ran head-to-head from the top of the stretch. At the wire, it was War Admiral by a head.

The Belmont Stakes proved to be War Admiral's easiest victory in the Triple Crown despite his stumbling at the start. In the fall of 1937, War Admiral won the first Pimlico Special and was named Horse of the Year.

In all, War Admiral won 21 of 26 starts and finished out of the money only one time.

### Calumet Star In '41

Once Trainer Ben Jones solved Whirlaway's bewildering habit of running extremely wide on the turns, there was no stopping the Calumet colt sired by Blenheim II. Jones devised a special blinker for the chestnut colt just in time for the 1941 Kentucky Derby.

With Eddie Arcaro riding, Whirlaway made a dramatic stretch run at Churchill Downs to set a new time record as he ran the mile and a quarter in 2.01% and won by eight lengths.

A week later, Whirlaway again came from far back to roll home in the Preakness by five and a half lengths. Arcaro described his Preakness experience like "riding a tornado." Only two challenged him in the Belmont and Whirlaway won racing's fifth Triple Crown and was the first of four in the 1940's.

Whirlaway, who won five other stakes in addition to the Triple Crown in 1941, was named Horse of the Year. He repeated for the title the following season when he accounted for eleven stakes. Whirlaway was retired at five after he pulled up lame after his second race in 1943. In all, he made 60 starts, won 32 races and was out of the money only four times.

Count Fleet shot like a meteor across the racing stage when World War II was raging in 1942 and 1943. After winning ten of fifteen starts as a 2-year-old, he was all but conceded the Triple Crown after being complimented with 132 pounds in the Experimental Handicap ratings.

A son of Reigh Count, the 1928 Derby winner, and foaled by Quickly by Haste, Count Fleet carried the colors of Mrs. John D. Hertz, wife of the Chicago taxicab executive. A striking brown colt, Count Fleet was hailed as a successor to Man O' War by some after his perfect six for six 3-year-old season.

The war-time ban on racing in Florida forced Count Fleet to train at Oaklawn Park in preparation for his 3-year-old campaign. In the Triple Crown, Count Fleet, with Johnny Longden riding, found little opposition. He galloped in the Derby, captured the Preakness with only three challengers by eight lengths, and then, after taking the Withers, annexed the Triple Crown with a 25-length triumph in the Belmont Stakes.

### Assault

### Surprise in 1946

Assault, the seventh Triple Crown winner, overcame long odds against his feet in 1946.

To start with, his dam, Iqual, sired by Equipoise, never raced. She was sickly as a foal and never recovered sufficiently to stand the rigors of training. Her first two foals were not notable. Her third, Assault, sired by Bold Venture, the 1936 Derby winner, had the misfortune to step on a surveyor's stake at the King Ranch in Texas where he was born.

The hoof healed but Assault had a tendency to favor the foot, making it appear that he was crippled. His trainer, Max Hirsch, at first thought the colt would not train because of his crooked foot. Assault was not impressive at two, winning only two races. Even after taking the Experimental Handicap and Wood Memorial at three, he went off at 8–1 odds in the Derby.

Favored in the Preakness, Assault won by a neck, after holding a four length advantage with an eighth mile to go. Then jockey Warren Mehrtens changed his tactics in the Belmont, reserving the colt and charging from behind to win by three lengths.

### Racing's First Millionaire

Citation, from Calumet Farm, capped the glorious '40's decade — the most glamorous in Triple Crown lore as four horses attained sport's most elusive prize.

There is little argument that the bay colt by Bull Lea — Hydroplane II by Hyperion, was the greatest horse of the '40's. Some observers believe he was the most accomplished horse ever to race, even superior to Man O'War. This debate probably will never be settled. Certainly he is on everyone's list of top Thoroughbreds in history.

Big Cy, although bred in Kentucky by Warren Wright, made his debut in Maryland, winning his first start at Havre de Grace in 1947. Later that year he captured the Pimlico Futurity on his way to an 8 for 9 year at two.

As a 3-year-old, Citation went 19 for 20. His only loss occurred at Havre de Grace in a sprint race he should not have lost. He was carried wide by a tiring horse and finished second to Saggy in the Chesapeake Trial.

The Triple Crown was hardly a challenge for Citation. His only real opposition in the Derby came from his stablemate Coaltown. Only three horses challenged him in the Preakness and the Belmont was also easily accomplished.

### Secretariat

### After 25 Years—Secretariat

Secretariat, often described as the perfect horse in appearance with his resplendent chestnut coat, might have been horse racing's greatest ambassador of the 20th century. The massive Virginia-bred colt from the Meadow Stable of Helen "Penny" Chenery, made a shambles of the Triple Crown in 1973.

Before he was nominated for the Triple Crown, Secretariat recorded a first — the first 2-year-old ever to be voted Horse of the Year. The son of Bold Ruler-Somethingroyal was a full-fledged celebrity well in advance of his Triple Crown heroics, having been syndicated for a then record \$6,080,000 early in his 3-year-old season.

In the Kentucky Derby, he set a record for the mile and a quarter, running the distance in 1.59-2/5. In a powerful move from last on the clubhouse turn, Secretariat captured the Preakness with ease. In the Belmont Stakes, Secretariat put on an awesome show, winning by 31 lengths to gain the Triple Crown, a prize which had gone unclaimed for a quarter of a century.

### Bargain Buy

Seattle Slew now has to share his Triple Crown record.

The grandson of Bold Ruler was the first Thoroughbred in history to capture the Triple Crown with an unbeaten record, a feat matched by Justify in 2018. After the Triple Crown, Seattle Slew lost only three of seventeen career starts on his way to total earnings of \$1,208,727.

Bred in Kentucky by Ben S. Castleman, Seattle Slew was purchased at the bargain price of \$17,500 at a Kentucky yearling auction by Mickey Taylor for his wife Karen, in whose silks the son of Bold Reasoning raced.

Veterinarian Dr. James Hill and his wife Sally shared owner-ship of Seattle Slew. It was Hill who had recommended the purchase of the colt. Seattle Slew was named the 2-year-old champion in 1976 and Horse of the Year as well as the top 3-year-old in 1977. William H. "Billy" Turner, Jr., a former steeplechase rider from Monkton, Md. was only 37 when he trained Seattle Slew to his 2- and 3-year-old championships.

Seattle Slew was retired for breeding in 1979 after being syndicated for \$12 million.

### **Affirmed**

### **Toughest Triple Crown**

Affirmed became the Triple Crown winner in 1978 and it was not easy. Affirmed's combined margin of victory in the Triple Crown was less than two lengths — 1½ lengths in the Derby, a neck in the Preakness and a head in the Belmont. Amazingly, each time it was Alydar, battling him to the wire. The Florida-bred colt — the first from that state to win the Triple Crown — raced for the Harbor View Farm of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Wolfson.

Affirmed won 22 of his 29 career starts, earning \$2,393,818. The chestnut son of Exclusive Native, was named Horse of the Year twice as well as 3-year-old champion in 1978. As a 4-year-old he captured seven stakes and beat out Spectacular Bid for Horse of the Year honors. After his 4-year-old campaign he was retired to Spendthrift Farm and syndicated for \$14.4 million.

### Triple Crown Drought Ends

American Pharoah became the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978, ending the longest drought between Triple Crowns in the series history.

Carrying the colors of the Zayat Stable, trained by six-time Preakness winner Bob Baffert and ridden by Victor Espinoza, American Pharoah's combined margin of victory in the Triple Crown was 13 1/2 lengths. After winning the Kentucky Derby by a length, American Pharoah left his opponents in his wake at Pimlico by drawing away to a seven-length victory in a driving rain and across a sloppy track before 131,680. Three weeks later, American Pharoah erased 37 years of frustration by winning the Belmont Stakes by 5 1/2 lengths in front of a 90,000.

American Pharoah, whose only defeat in five races going into the Triple Crown was in his racing debut, ended his career with a 6 1/2-length victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Three months later, he was named Horse of the Year and 3-year-old champion at the 45th Eclipse Awards.

Retiring with nine victories in 11 starts and \$8,650,300, American Pharoah stands at Coolmore America in Kentucky.

### Rare Feat

Justify joined Seattle Slew (1977) as the second horse to capture the Triple Crown without a loss, but made history as the only one to sweep the series without having raced as a 2-year-old.

It was the second successful Triple Crown bid in four years following American Pharoah who, like Justify, is trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert. In doing so, Baffert put his name alongside 'Sunny Jim' Fitzsimmons (Gallant Fox 1930, Omaha 1935) as the only trainers to win the Triple Crown twice.

Purchased by China Horse Club and Maverick Racing for \$500,000 as a yearling, Justify made 52-year-old Hall of Famer Mike Smith the oldest jockey to win a Triple Crown.


A pulled muscle kept Justify from making a start until February of his 3-year-old season, a 9 ½-length front-running maiden special weight romp under jockey Drayden Van Dyke. Smith took over for a 6 ½-length optional claiming allowance victory in March, following up with a three-length score in his stakes debut, the Santa Anita Derby.
