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
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


A new NOME

The summer holidays had just begun.


Colin picked up his suitcase and got into his aunt's car.

PROCESSING QUESTION:

PROCESSING QUESTIONS:

How would you feel if you had to leave your home and go and live somewhere else?

What makes Gozo different from Malta?

PROCESSING QUESTIONS:

What is healthy food?

Why is it important to eat healthy food?

Do you eat healthy food? Do you drink water and white milk?

PROCESSING QUESTIONS:

Do you think Colin is still very unhappy?

What can you do to feel better, when you are sad?

Can you mention some people you feel comfortable talking to when you need to speak to someone about how you are feeling?

Why is it important to discuss your feelings?

The days passed and Colin got used to his new life although he wanted to see his mummy again.... who was now in a hospital in England.

He really enjoyed going on adventures with his cousin in the fields and near the trees. They made a secret camp, build a tree house, saw wild rabbits and hedgehogs. They saw the bees making honey and went on long rides with their bicycles. Colin used his uncle's bike.
