Aim

To improve everyday English language skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking

Course Content

- The language skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking at the appropriate level, relevant to a variety of everyday situations. A range of teaching methods and styles are used, tailored to individual learning needs. Progress is continually monitored and students are sometimes tutored in very small groups (2 to 4 people) separate to the main class so that specific needs may be addressed. Support, advice and guidance is always available to ensure that progress and achievement is maximised
