The Road still top

Chester Road are still the surprise leaders at the top of the Flowfit Shropshire Premier Bowling League after another solid month from them. They only started with 3 at St Georges but then reeled off two 11-3 wins, the latter at Wem USC, before coming from behind to beat Castlefields 9-5. They then got a good 5 at Newport, much better than what they got in previous years there. Meole Brace are 2nd but suffered a 10-4 defeat at Bylet at the end of the month, after getting solid 5s at Sir John Bayley and Ifton, but still sit 5 points behind the leaders with an extra home game left. Castlefields have moved up to their highest position since the second week after a couple of good home wins, including a 13-1 hammering of the Champions Newport. They will be ruing more near misses away, losing by 2 at Wem USC and by 13 at Chester Road. St Georges are in 4th with a game in hand, although away at the Bayley, the team directly below them. They started the month well after beating Chester Road 11-3 but then suffered a disappointing 2 at Burway and then two 9-5 home wins, the second over bottom placed Hadley USC. The Bayley only suffered one defeat in July, losing 11-3 at Hanwood, but only by 19. They won at Bylet and Wrockwardine Wood, with a 9-5 win over rivals Meole Brace sandwiched in between.

Ifton sit on the fringes of the top 5, 15 points behind Chester Road, after picking up in the month. A good 12-2 home win over Hadley USC was followed by solid away results, 5 at St Georges and Wrockwardine Wood and 4 at Hanwood. Bowring are out of the top 6 for the first time in a while after having an average month, with only two 10-4 home wins and 2 at Wem, although a number of close cards went against them that night. They did get a great 6 at Castlefields though and 4 at Hanwood. Hanwood themselves are on the fringes of a top 6 finish after three good home wins, including an 11-3 win over previous leaders Sir John Bayley. Burway are another team that could break into the top 6 with a good finish after two good home wins in July, 12-2 over St Georges and 10-4 over Hanwood. Newport are their lowest position for over 5 years, 10th place, but do have a home game in hand. They didn't have the best of months, only 1 at Castlefields and a 9-5 home win over Chester Road but did beat Hanwood 11-3 and get 4 at Meole. Wem USC and Wrockwardine Wood are adrift of the top 10 but both are clear of finishing bottom. Wem's form dipped at the start

of the month with just 2 at Hadley but came frombehind to beat Castlefields 8-6 and by 2 and then beat Bowring 12-2, after losing 11-3 at home to Chester Road two weeks before! Wrockwardine Wood also had a couple of good home wins to steer them from trouble, 11-3 over Burway and 9-5 over Ifton, this despite just losing at home over the Bayley. Bylet recovered from a winless June to win two home games in July, 9-5 over Burway and 10-4 over Meole as they moved 16 points clear over HadleyUSC at the bottom. Despite a 12-2 home win over Wem USC the next three games, all away, only yielded 8 points, but 5 of those came in their last game of the month at St Georges.

Hanwood and Road most improved

Hanwood are still the most improved team from last season, but Chester Road are fast closing in behind with their terrific season showing no signs of letting up. Conversely, Champions Newport are the least improved.
