



Keenan Recycling Installs VCU's For Aberdeen City Bio Waste

Keenan Recycling based at New Deer have for many years been windrow composting the garden waste supplied by SITA as part of their contract with Aberdeen City Council.

Keenan Recycling processed over 25,000 tonnes of this waste stream in 2007. However to meet diversion of biodegradable waste from landfill targets, Aberdeen City Council is to commence the collection of food waste during 2008. This will be co-collected with the garden waste.

Due to the regulations regarding the composting of food waste Keenan Recycling needed to select a technology that could meet stringent processing requirements

Having been successfully selected for funding from the WRAP organics program Keenan Recycling were obliged to complete a full due diligence evaluation of available technologies for approval.

During this phase of the project Keenan Recycling looked in depth at the various technology options and decided to go forward with VCU Europa for the delivery of a plant which met their site requirements and was fully proven.

Delivery of the 12 VCU <sup>TM</sup> chambers has been made and the chambers are now installed and have been mechanically and electrically tested. Bio Commissioning will commence in May 2008.
