FUNDING AVAILABLE TO HELP LA PINE AREA WOODLAND OWNERS

Reduce wildfire risk, improve forest health Apply for financial assistance with NRCS by February 17, 2017. Private woodland owners in the La Pine watershed can reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire on their land with conservation assistance now available from the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). NRCS is teaming up with multiple Central Oregon agencies and groups to provide much-needed restoration on public and private forests in the greater La Pine area.

This year NRCS is offering \$500,000 to help private woodland owners in the greater La Pine area reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire and improve forest health on their property.

Interested landowners should submit applications by February 17 to the NRCS office in Redmond (625 SE Salmon Avenue, Suite 4) to be considered for the current round of funding.

The funding will help woodland owners perform conservation practices like pre-commercial thinning, slash treatment, and fuel breaks. These practices reduce the amount of "fuels" (such as dense, overstocked trees, shrubs and invasive plants) that cause a wildfire to spread higher into the canopy where it causes the most damage. A properly thinned forest holds wildfire lower to the ground, allowing safer access for firefighters to quench the flames.

Thinning also helps reduce the spread of insects and disease that impact marketable timber growth and improves wildlife habitat by providing opened spaces for elk, deer and other species.

NRCS is offering the financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)—a voluntary Farm Bill program that reimburses landowners for a portion of the cost to implement conservation practices on private agricultural lands, including woodlands and forests.

This forest restoration effort—called the Greater La Pine Basin Cohesive Strategy Project—began last year and is funded by the Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Initiative. The Joint Chiefs initiative is a partnership between two USDA agencies—NRCS and the Forest Service—that reduces wildfire risk on both public and private forests. NRCS is offering assistance to help private landowners treat their woods and forests; and the Forest Service will be performing similar restoration on the federal side of the project boundary in the Deschutes National Forest.

The La Pine project will take place over three years, targeting restoration on nearly 345,000 acres of forest-lands—which includes state, federal and private lands in southern Deschutes County and northern Klamath County.

"By doing this proactive forest restoration work across the public and private boundaries, we can create a more fire-adapted community while also significantly enhancing the health and productivity of our precious forests," said Tom Bennett, NRCS district conservationist in Redmond.

In addition to the NRCS funding, other project partners are offering assistance to woodland owners to help them protect their forests. The Oregon Department of Forestry and Walker Range Fire Protection District have funds available to help landowners within the Greater La Pine Area. Smaller, more residential woodland owners in Deschutes County may get assistance through Project Wildfire; and Oregon State University Extension Service offers advice and tips on how to best manage forests and woodlands.



Bring New Writing Programs to Libraries

Deschutes Public Library partners with Caldera Artists in Residence to bring dynamic new writing workshops to Central Oregon

Writing can be a lonely activity, but often times inspiration can come from working with a group. 


Owners should be prepared in the event of a disaster:

- Horse trailer or contact person(s) with trailer
- Horse identification: micro chip, tattoo, photos and descriptions, animal safe paint (spray or paint on your information), grab and go kit with information/photos.phone numbers/alternate phone numbers and any important veterinary or medical /care information, alternate place to keep your horse in the EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY

Kit with halter, feed and water buckets **EVACUATION PROCEDURES:**

IF time and notice allows, evacuate all animals with you





IF NOT, now is the time to stock up on the things you will need. Don't put off doing what you should do now. It may just make the difference between being able to save the life of your pet. **HERE IS A SHOPPING LIST:**

Food: Use the brand that your animal is used to. Have at least enough to last one week. Be sure to rotate the food to keep it fresh. Include in your supplies a feeding and watering dish in case the one you usually use is destroyed or lost.

Water: Have enough water to last at least one week for each pet in the household. Be sure to rotate the water so that it stays fresh.

SANITATION: A litter box and litter enough to last one week. A scooper to keep litter box clean Plastic bags to dispose of animal waste.

A small bottle of soap for cleaning animal dishes, Paper Towels for drying, Medical & Identification Always keep ID on your pet (tag, microchip, tattoo)

In a Grab & Go Kit: Make copies of all medical, Rx, Photos of your pet







COLD WEATHER CONSIDERATIONS

As frigid, below freezing temperatures and snow hit Central Oregon, the Humane Society of Central Oregon would like to remind people to provide extra care for their pets.

- Pets are best kept inside.
- Bring your pet inside when the temperatures drop, also consider the wind-chill factor.
- Dogs and cats can get frost bitten ears, nose, and feet if left outside.
- Chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate paws. Buy "pet safe" ice melters. Wash off paws if pets have walked through chemicals.
- If your pet must be kept outside:
- -Provide a dry, elevated dog house with clean dry bedding and a flap over the opening to keep drafts out. Heated pet beds are available.
- -Make sure the water bowl does not freeze. Heated water bowls are available.
- -Outdoor pets need more calories to produce body heat.
- Make sure a cat has not crawled under your car seeking shelter and warmth near the engine. Tap on hood before starting the engine.
- Booties allow your dog to walk in the snow and prevent injury from ice.
- Dog jackets and sweaters are more than fashion, they will keep small, senior and single coated dogs warm.
- Keep antifreeze, salt and other household poisons away from pets.
- Watch your pet around heating stoves to prevent burns and dehydration.
- Horses, chickens and other livestock need winter care too:
- -Make sure there is clean, dry bedding. Moist bedding can cause infection.
- -Make sure water in trough does not freeze.
- -Have hooves checked and prepared for winter.

COUNTY REMINDS PROPERTY OWNERS TO KEEP

SIDEWALKS CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE

As winter arrives in Central Oregon, the Deschutes County Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) reminds property owners to keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice.

Bend, La Pine, Redmond, and Sisters all have ordinances relating to the yearround clearing of sidewalks. While the language varies, the message is the same – business or property owners must remove ice or snow from the sidewalk adjoining their property within a defined time to keep pedestrian walkways clear. Generally, in business districts, the time limit is six hours and in residential areas it is 24 hours.

These city codes help make sidewalks safer and encourage good business practices. When pathways are clear, the message to customers is that the business cares about safety and welcomes access for all to the front door.

The BPAC is an advisory committee of the Deschutes County Commission that seeks to improve conditions for bicyclists and pedestrians throughout Deschutes County. Each year, BPAC recognizes businesses and residents that go above and beyond their legal obligations to keep sidewalks free of snow and ice with Safe Sidewalk awards.
