For many years the minibus was well used on Sunday mornings with 10 or more parishioners. However in recent years numbers have dwindled and now there are only 2 parishioners who use this facility, and even these parishioners do not use the service every week. Both have told us that they can make alternative arrangements to get to Mass. Unless more eligible parishioners living in Kingfield/Barnsbury come forward to use the minibus the service will be withdrawn, as we cannot justify continuing with such few passengers. # Readings for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 58:7-10

There is a saying which we are all familiar with – 'When all is said and done, there's a lot more said than done'. Faith, hope and charity only really come alive when they are done.

**Psalm 111: 4-9** The good man is a light in the darkness for the upright.

## 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul is only too aware of his own weakness and limitations. Yet in the midst of knowing this he experiences the power of God active in him. Because of this he can sincerely share the crucified and risen Christ with the Church. We too have been commissioned to preach the Word and can only do so authentically when we realise our own weakness and double standards.

### Matthew 5:13-16

In Jesus' time salt was used for much more than seasoning food. When mixed with animal dung, made into a patty and placed on a slab of salt, the chemical reaction gave off quite a heat. This was how ovens were fired. Eventually the catalytic ability of the salt slab would wear out, but it still had its use as a piece of paving. The Gospel is really about Jesus urging his disciples to be on fire and in doing so let his light shine so that all can see.
