Number of Staff & Equipment	Local Policing & Partnership Officers The neighbourhood team based at Camborne comprises of a Neighbourhood Sgt, seven neighbourhood beat managers (NBMs) and seven police community support officers (PCSOs). The team work together to patrol and tackle problems within the Camborne, Pool and Redruth areas. All of the Neighbourhood team have areas that they specifically cover but this will be flexible depending on the demand.
	Response Function There are five shifts covering the entire Camborne, Pool & Redruth sector, providing 24/7 cover, however there are no specific response resources dedicated to the town centre. There are five teams of response officers based at Camborne providing 24/7 cover. Each team comprises of a sergeant and a maximum of seven constables. These officers cover Camborne, Pool and Redruth but none are dedicated to any specific location within that geographic area.
	Local Investigation Function General crime investigation is conducted by the response officers in additional to responding to calls and attending incidents on a 24/7 basis. More serious crimes are investigated by CID officers based at Camborne where there are a team of nine detective constables and a two detective sergeants. There is also a dedicated department based at Camborne who investigate sexual offences and domestic abuse crimes not only in the Camborne area but also across the whole of Cornwall. 	Camborne has a strong Special Constabulary contingent who provides a service most evenings and weekends, in addition to their normal duties they provide a police presence at events taking place throughout the year, such as Christmas Lights, Remembrance Services & Trevithick Day. In addition to this, Camborne also have 25 Police Cadets (aged 13 to 18 yrs) who report for duty every other Wednesday. They also provide a visible police presence at local events such as those already mentioned above. Where necessary other resources from within West Cornwall Local Policing Area can be called upon to deal with particular issues as and when they arise.

Performance measure	Whilst there is no specific target with regards to detections there is now much greater emphasis placed on identifying threat, harm and risk. Protecting the vulnerable, reducing crime and safeguarding communities are all part of the force mission.
