How to Make Whitewash

What you need:

- Glass Cleaner
- Lint-free Cloth
- Dust Mask
- Water Resistant Gloves
- Bucket
- Hydrated Lime (Calcium Hydroxide
 follow all
 - recommended precautions from manufacturer)
- Salt
- Paint Stir Stick
- Painters Tape
- Paint Brush
- Vinegar

- Windows that have been whitewashed will allow some light in but help block the transmission of heat from the sun or a wildfire.
- Typically used on house windows, garages, sheds, greenhouses or outbuildings.
- Using whitewash on your windows can help prevent the radiant heat from a wildfire from setting furniture inside your home on fire.
 - 1. Wash the window surface with Glass Cleaner.
- 2. Wipe the window dry with lint-free cloth.
- 3. Wear Dust Mask & Heavy Gloves *before* opening ingredients. Hydrated Lime may cause skin irritation. Keep vinegar nearby to rinse any lime from your skin immediately.
- 4. Combine 12 cups of Hydrated Lime Powder with 4 cups of Salt.
- 5. Mix with 2 Gallons of water. Mix small amounts of lime mixture and water at a time.
- 6. Let mixture sit overnight so the lime completely dissolves. Stir thoroughly before use.
- 7. Tape the window frames with Painters Tape.
- 3. Paint whitewash onto exterior window surface with a standard Paint Brush, allow to dry.

 Apply 2-3 coats to get desired coating. (not suitable for use inside your home)
- 9. Whitewash your windows days before evacuation.
- 10. After the danger is past, remove using water and a sponge, light scrubbing will remove any residue.
