**New £1.6million investment in projects in North Yorkshire.** New projects will support young people and their families living on the North Yorkshire Coast as part of the Opportunity Area programme: Arts and cultural activities for more than 3,500 young people in Scarborough, Whitby and Filey

Meet the leader who aims to help 35,000 young people in Bradford and Doncaster achieve their goals. "Doncaster and Bradford have been designated as opportunity areas by the Government and have been awarded some additional funding"

**Next generation of young people gaining the skills Britain needs.** Results day marks the culmination of hard work from students and teachers, with reformed 'A' Levels better preparing young people university or the workplace:

**Boost for vulnerable children through trusted relationships**. Home Office awards £13 million to local authorities to help young people at risk of abuse: Rotherham, North Yorkshire, York and Bradford to benefit

# Youth Voice Yorkshire and Humber

These three young people want to change the world - but they need you to help them. With the party conference season just around the corner, Hull Live invited three local politicians to explain why politics is important for the younger generation. Here is what they said:

"I knew I wanted to be in politics before I really understood what it would entail"

Young people passionate about West Yorkshire transport, says Youth Council. "Transport is one of the top issues young people are most passionate about," is what the Leeds Youth Council told Bus18 leaders when they met at Leeds Civic Hall last at a meeting in August:

Over 150 under 19 year-olds helped develop the new ticket

Young people across the UK are being urged to take part in a survey to decide the key issues that youth leaders will debate in the House of Commons later this year. ## **National News**

**New unit to tackle exploitation of vulnerable young people.** A new national response unit will be established to help local authorities support vulnerable children at risk of exploitation by criminal gangs: "To help stop child sexual exploitation, trafficking, modern slavery"

The musicians trying to stop domestic violence among young people. An independent record label is looking to highlight what it feels is the worsening problem of domestic violence affecting young people: "There is more awareness of domestic violence now than 15 or 20 years ago"

More young people will use Snapchat than Facebook by the end of 2018. According to eMarketer's latest forecast on social network usage, the number of Snapchat users in the UK will reach 16.2 million by the end of the year. Around 31% (or 5 million) will be in the younger age bracket: Snapchat's user base will overtake Facebook's among 18 to 24 year-olds in the UK

**Vegan Beauty Market booms as Young People ditch animal products.** Launches have more than doubled in the past five years - growing by 175%:

Analysts have put the boom largely down to young consumers - Gen Z and Millennials

**Government likely to evaluate National Citizen Service next year**. A report on the evaluation options, produced by the consultancy London Economics, looks at four options for tracking the long-term effects on participants: No evaluation has focused on the long-term outcomes

#### **Reports and Studies**

A survey of more than 4,000 18-30-year olds by charity Young Women's Trust found one in five are in debt all the time. A quarter have worse debt levels now than last year and a third don't think they'll be out of debt any time soon, with many borrowing from their parents to get by:

Young women are more likely to be in a difficult financial situation

"Huge numbers" of young people are struggling to meet basic living standards due to low pay, despite being the "most qualified group of workers ever," the TUC has claimed.

Launched a new app, Work Smart, which helps young people to progress at work

**Are they shouting because of me?** Voices of children living in households with domestic abuse, parental substance misuse and mental health issues:

"I wish my mum had gotten help earlier. She knew she needed help"

#### Health

A Quarter of 14-year-old girls in UK have self-harmed, report finds. "There is a spike in the brain chemical dopamine around the age of 14 which makes people more prone to risk-taking and there are a lot of hormones. It's a crucial stage in a young person's neurological development." "Self-harm at its root is a coping mechanism like having a glass of wine or smoking a cigarette"

A (very) short film introducing the topic of period poverty:

Ending period poverty - a positive case study

**Study of teenage drinkers and smokers shows 'significant damage' to arteries.** Teenagers who smoke or consume alcohol have much stiffer arteries than those who don't, putting them on the path to heart disease and stroke: "Arterial stiffness indicates damage to the blood vessels"
