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



# Our pre-summer regional programme offers five one-day jazz workshops for young musicians aged 8-18.

## NYJC has been going for 13 years.

We provide creative learning experiences for young people who enjoy composition and improvised music. *That might be you!?* 

We engage inspirational tutors who are world class professional musicians. They are experienced in teaching and performing improvised music and composition of all kinds.

Each year, we run a world-renowned summer school and feeder short course, preparing and inspiring 80 of the nation's best young jazz musicians (selected from a 14 day audition tour) for a career in music.

Each Sunday workshop ends with an informal concert to family and friends featuring performances of pieces learned that day. Everyone gets to play within a supportive setting that everyone enjoys!

Cost: £120 for the 4 day course

A bursary scheme is available for young people whose household is in receipt of benefits or on low income: up to 100% off plus we help with your travel costs. You can request this when you apply.

Participants must pay for the full course upon joining and we ask students to sign an agreement to come to all dates. This makes sure all players and bands can develop together without gaps from missing band members. If you have a problem paying in full please get in touch so we can discuss how you might be able to pay in instalments.

Feel free to come to the first session for a taster! We are happy for participants to attend the first session as a taster. We'll refund if you don't want to come back, but require you to commit to all future sessions if you do return.
