Minutes from the last meeting

Minutes and actions from the last meeting were discussed including the presentation delivered by Peter Brownbill Partnerships Manager from UA92 on the developments and their open day back in October. Peter spoke to the volunteer managers about how the University was keen to work closely with local VCSE organisations and community projects.

• Using Volunteers to support social inclusion

Adrian Bates Trafford Partnership and Communities Manager introduced some of the volunteer-led services currently working in Trafford to help reduce social isolation amongst Trafford residents, including Greater Manchester Fire & Rescue Service's Community Wellbeing volunteer service and North West Ambulance Service's new Q-Volunteer service, and a potential new social prescribing service linked to GP surgeries. The group heard from Kate Pemrick, Volunteer Coordinator for GMFRS about the Community Wellbeing service, and a look at how they can work more in partnership with other partners working to reduce social isolation with a formation of a Community Wellbeing Trafford Partnership, with the first meeting in January. The group also heard from Trudi Jackson the new Q-Volunteer North West Ambulance service.

Adrian led a group table discussion to gather opinions on what a new Social Prescribing model should look like.

Questions discussed included:

Understanding the need – what experiences do you have of social isolation in Trafford? What are the challenges faced in identifying and supporting socially isolated people? How could a volunteer-led service address these challenges and connect socially isolated people?

What would that service look like, and how would it compliment current provision?
