What are cataracts?

Cataracts are very common and usually develop as we age. They are caused by the formation of cloudy or misty patches in the clear lens inside the eye.

What are the symptoms?

At first, you may not notice any symptoms. But usually over time, you will experience blurred or cloudy vision, or have patches where your vision is less clear.

Who needs cataract surgery?

When it becomes difficult to see and carry out your normal daily activities, it is time to consider cataract surgery. This involves removing the cloudy lens (cataract) and replacing it with a new, artificial clear lens. It's an extremely common procedure nowadays with thousands of cataract replacements successfully carried out each year.

What are the benefits?

The most obvious is the improvement in your vision and, of course, your quality of life. Surgery is the only way to restore clarity, otherwise it is likely your vision will gradually get worse.
