#### We Never Forget Our 'Why?'

#### **Meet Ronaleen Brown:**



Today we celebrate Military Family Member Ronaleen Brown! Following the death of her husband, an Army Veteran, in 2007, the young mother of three daughters, ages 7, 11 and 12, struggled financially and emotionally. By June 2018, she still hadn't received widows' benefits, GI Bill benefits and more. Her financial situation felt crushing when she first arrived at Mt. Carmel. With assistance from our community partners — the Peak Military Care Network (PMCN) referral to Mt. Carmel; personal financial counselor Liz Foster of The Pikes Peak Workforce Center; and The Home Front Cares staff — her situation quickly improved. With one month's rent

covered by Homefront Cares, Liz helped prevent repossession of the family car. Ronaleen and Liz then developed a right-sized budget, allowing Ronaleen to see that she could live within her means. Today, her car is paid off, she confidently works full-time in a service industry, is receiving many benefits she is eligible for, and she is more intentional about her finances. "As a widow of a great veteran and a mother to three kids, I never thought I'd be able to get myself out of my financial situation without help. There are a lot of bumps in the road when you lose someone," said Ronaleen, "At Mt. Carmel, they helped me breathe again. Because of their help, I'm going to make it." Ronaleen credits her faith and her daughters for the strength to work through her challenges.

#### **Meet Daniel Maxwell:**

Today we celebrate U.S. Army Soldier Daniel Maxwell! After working with Mt. Carmel Peer Navigators, Daniel is excited about post-service career opportunities as he begins his transition from uniformed service. "I'm considering medical device sales, but I'm open to e-commerce in other industries as well. I know sales are a good fit because I place a high value on professional autonomy, and sales align with my skills and interests." These points were underscored in mock interviews with industry professionals at Mt. Carmel when Daniel received informal feedback from three local employers. Additional support included one-on-one interview preparation as well as resume and LinkedIn feedback. "Mt. Carmel has incredible programs and offers a wealth of resources for veterans," said Daniel. "I was impressed by their network and the opportunities offered to help transition successfully into the private sector. While it's difficult to put into words all of the emotions involved in making a significant career change, excitement is certainly one of them. I'm most excited about the opportunity for personal/professional growth in a completely new environment."
