On the 7th October, we welcomed ten fertilised eggs in a special incubator from 'Living Eggs' to BFS.



Pupils had done some work prior to their arrival, about life cycles, caring for chicks and they even looked at the development of an embryo inside an egg shell. On Wednesday 9th October, pupils (and staff) watched closely as the chicks began the process of 'pipping'. They were fascinated watching the eggs wobble and the chicks' little beaks break through the shells. We were lucky enough to have nine healthy chicks from our batch.







During the second week, all our pupils (and staff) had the opportunity to handle the very cute and fluffy little chicks!





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You can see from the photos how much the children enjoyed this bit (and staff too!). Most pupils took part in cleaning the brooder box, caring for the chicks and weighing them.





The work the children produced was fantastic! From chick masks and feather pictures to growth charts and observational drawings! All pupils thoroughly enjoyed this 'egg-citing' experiential learning project and we hope we can do it again in the future! Thank you 'Living Eggs'!

What this new chapter has planned for me



Precision Pallets Visit


