Did You Know?

A dollar will stay in the community it was spent in and recirculate an average of 3 or more times.

Streets, police, fire, water, parks, boat landings, schools, and more, all depend on locally used dollars. When communities send their purchasing dollars elsewhere, we see a loss in revenue and property taxes increase. Residents that stay within Sheboygan to eat, buy groceries, purchase gas, buy tires, and so forth are driving local growth. Additionally, business owners that make a conscious effort to hire Sheboygan employees and contractors are making a difference. No matter how big or small, all efforts help.

Together, we can continue to proudly call Sheboygan our home.

Why is this Important?

Our profits are used to live. Opportunity



In 2016, there was a study done in Sheboygan County that indicated that we have a significant opportunity to grow our local economy. The study was completed by "The Rail Coach". They concluded that we have retail dollars leakage or loss of \$1.1 billion per year. If we lost only 1/2 of that, we would put \$2.5 million dollars back into Sheboygan County dedicated to city and county roads from the 1/2 percent. Not to mention, the money would circulate in Sheboygan County and buy more products. Can you think of how this county would grow with an injection of 500 million dollars per year?

Bottom Line

We can be complacent and wait to see what happens next. If the local economy doesn't produce enough local business dollars and the local tax revenues decline to \$1.1 billion of leakage, don't worry, the fire trucks will still run, the water will flow, the parks will probably still be beautiful, and the roads will be repaired slowly as they continue to dilapidate, and our potential employees will continue to leave and be harder to retain for more affluent communities.

If we continue to lose dollars from our county everything can be funded with increases in your Sheboygan County property, business taxes, and misc. tax increases.
