Everyone has walked past a forlorn and unloved historic building at some time. You may have asked why isn't someone doing something with it? The answer is often complex and the solutions equally so. It takes a special group of people to help keep these buildings alive to benefit the community.

Scottish Historic Building Trust (SHBT) is the charity working with the Kyle and Carrick Civic Society and Ayr Station Hotel Community Action Group to rescue the Station Hotel from possible demolition and find a new and sustainable future as a Gateway to the Town of Ayr.

Built in 1886 to designs by Andrew Galloway for the Glasgow and South Western Railway, the hotel is in the French Chateau Style. It was described as 'A Castle in Ayr' when it opened catering for the newly mobile Scots looking for a holiday along the coast. Boasting marble-clad interiors, the hotel offered seawater bathing, golf excursions and Robert Burns tours. As hotel occupancy declined, it was sold to overseas investors and closed in 2013.

Still a much loved icon to the community of Ayr, serving as a Gateway to the Town from the Railway Station, the building now lies abandoned and a Dangerous Buildings Notice has been served on the current owners.

South Ayrshire Council are working with Network Rail to protect the public from any danger and an exclusion zone has been set up around the building. It is important that the Station remains open and alternative ticketing accommodation has been provided.

The building is in poor condition due to lack of maintenance and the Council is undertaking remedial work to remove any dangers from the public. It is important that action is taken now, and before the Winter to prevent any further deterioration. The aim is to save this important building which not only led to construction of the thriving Turnberry Hotel but could also deliver the same social impact to the Town of Ayr with a vibrant and successful restoration.

Scottish Historic Buildings Trust is working with the Kyle and Carrick Civic Society and the Ayr Station Hotel Community Action Group to undertake a Feasibility Study. This will consider future uses for the Station Hotel and will aim to see the building restored and given back its place as a working station and Gateway to the Town of Ayr whilst providing a sustainable future for the building.
