Throughout the year, there will be a variety of fundraising efforts in which we hope you will participate, including the Society's first ever Golf Classic on Monday, June 29, at Sodus Bay Heights Golf Club. If you aren't a golfer, worry not, because there will be many ways to be actively involved in ensuring the success our first annual tournament! So, please reserve June 29 to either play, volunteer or join the group for dinner and entertainment at the end of the day.

In addition to regular annual events such as Homecoming, the Community Garage Sale and the Moonlight Cemetery Tour, W-PHS will host its **4th Home Tour on Saturday, September 12.** The 2020 tour will showcase "Pultneyville Porches" on, or overlooking, the southern shore of beautiful Lake Ontario. 


# Fort Ontario Conference—April 2020

Many of you may know, but some of you may not know, that the only Holocaust survivor camp in the United States was located on Federal Property in Oswego. The Safe Haven Holocaust Survivor Emergency Refugee Shelter was located just outside the gates of Fort Ontario.

The established quotas for European Jews had already been exceeded by the summer of 1944, so when a refugee ship arrived in New York Harbor the instructions were to turn it away.

I don't recall all the intrigue and dealing, however, President Roosevelt was able to strike a deal that allowed them to land in New York. The deal included an agreement that the refugees would leave as soon as the war was over.



The Safe Haven Refugee Emergency Shelter is now a museum and the story is amazing. The 2020 Fort Ontario Conference this year will focus exclusively on "Save Haven." The Conference is April 25 – 26, 2020.

I recommend this conference. It is always excellent and also over-subscribed (sold out).

Pormed in 1964 and chartered in 1971, the Williamson-Pultneyville Historical Society has as its mission to nurture and share the history of the Township of Williamson through preserving and protecting select historic structures, landmarks, objects and written materials that reflect the unique heritage of this community.

The Society is located in a landmark dwelling known as the *Auchampaugh* home at 4130 Mill St. This house was built for Harvey Auchampaugh about 1858 by Russell Cole, a local blacksmith and builder. Auchampaugh was a prominent businessman in the hamlet, a harness maker, drugstore proprietor and Postmaster for several years.



Rooms in the home contain exhibits, archived information, a gift shop and business office. The Society House is regularly open the third weekend in June through the first weekend in October, Friday through Sunday, 1-4 p.m., by appointment and throughout Homecoming weekend and during the Annual Community Garage Sale.
