Readings for the Presentation of the Lord

Malachi 3:1-4

The Prophet Malachi seems to point to John the Baptist as the messenger who will prepare a way for the Lord. The Prophet Malachi assures us that that Lord will come. 'The Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his temple'. We hear the message of John the Baptist and the call of the Prophet to be ready to receive the Lord when he comes again.

Psalm 23: 7-10

Who is the king of glory? It is the Lord.

Hebrews 2: 14-18

Jesus fully shared in our human nature and so he understands us. He knows our needs. This enables Jesus to be compassionate towards us. As high priest he not only forgives our sins but intercedes for us from his place at the right hand of God. It is a great reassurance for us to know that Jesus is so familiar with us.

Luke 2: 22-40

The prophecy described in today's First Reading is fulfilled, the Lord enters his temple. Mary and Joseph fulfil the requirements of the law and present their son in the temple. There they encounter Simeon and Anna, two people who spent years dedicated to prayer. Prompted by the Spirit, Simeon recognises Jesus as the Messiah and the light of the world. This was a blessed moment, once described as 'a moment when the world's old age welcome into its arms the eternal youth of God'. (Glenstal Bible Missal). Yet this moment is tinged with sorrow as Simeon speaks to Mary of the future suffering her son will endure. A reminder that there is no Easter Sunday without Good Friday.

1 Corinthians 2: 1-5; Matthew 5: 13-16.

Did you know...? The Catechism says:

529 The presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its encounter with the Saviour—the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light to the nations" and the "glory of Israel", but also "a sign that is spoken against". The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation God had "prepared in the presence of all peoples".
