The Congress Theatre Celebrate the Refurbishment of the Theatre!

In recent months the Theatre has undergone a huge amount of investment including, new electric moveable seating, modified/upgraded Bar facilities, much needed air-conditioning, a folding wall to increase room hire capacity and new stage curtains, to name but a few of the improvements. So far a total of £165k has been invested in the Theatre and it is with a huge thanks to The Arts Council of Wales, Cwmbran Trust, Barclays Bank, our fundraising volunteers and Torfaen's Neighbourhood Services team who have helped enable these works to happen.



The Congress Theatre was opened on 19th October 1972 as a multipurpose hall. It lacked the facilities of a conventional theatre and only hosted events such as celebrity lectures, union meetings and local tribunals. In 1974 the entire building was closed, revamped, and modified to incorporate facilities to offer a broader entertainment offer. The Theatre reopened in 1975 as a performance venue with a 306 auditorium capacity, dressing rooms and theatrical lighting. In 1992 when threatened with closure, a group of theatre enthusiasts lead by Mr Ron Prosser, formed a committee to take on the running of the building and then a year later, in April 1993 the Theatre formally became the Congress Theatre Co. 25 years on, after much hard work and support from our friends, you can see the thriving venue its become today.

This year the Charity and our resident Youth Theatre celebrated its 25th Anniversary. The Youth Theatre is still run by its original founder Rachel Hamilton and its musical director Wayne Beecham and continues to play a vital role in engaging local young people in creative and motivational ways. The Congress Theatre generates most of its revenue from Theatre Hire, but it also receives financial support from Torfaen County Borough Council, Cwmbran Community Council, Cwmbran Centre and Croesyceiliog & Llanyravon Community Council. This support is vital to help with expensive day to day running costs and ongoing maintenance of the building.

Age Connects Torfaen - Volunteer Driver

After 5 years and efforts to raise the necessary funds, the completion of the Hospital Memorial in Pontypool Park is almost complete. The paths have been laid and the sloping bank tiered. We shall very shortly prepare the ground for the planting of samples of medicinal plants – although it may not be possible to complete all the planting until the Spring. The information board is prepared and is ready for positioning. It will be a great relief to complete the work.

We are now desperately trying to raise the funds to rescue the beautiful Japan Ware mural at the bottom of Tesco steps by the underpass. The ivy, undergrowth, trees and weeds have all been removed, This has now revealed the full extent of the damage to the mural. Large chunks of tiles have fallen off and are continuing to fall off. If the deterioration is not dealt with in the near future, it will be past redemption. We are open to any suggestions to raise the £800 to remove and store the tiles, which we collect as they fall off and then £8,000.00 to completely restore it to its former glory.

Be Independent Helpline

If you live in Torfaen, you can now call one number to find out the information you need to enjoy an independent life.

Be Independent is brought to you by the Public Service Board who want to make this number the only one people need to find out local information on services.

Be Independent are now working in partnership with South Wales Fire and Rescue Service; we are now offering FREE Home Fire Safety Checks.

What is a Home Fire Safety Check?

A Home Fire Safety Check is an entirely free service and will take around 30 minutes to carry out. It involves an individual from South Wales Fire and Rescue Service assessing a person's home and advising on fire risks and assisting the householder to develop an escape plan in case of fire. The aim is to look at behaviours and to educate about potential risks within the home.

Free smoke alarms will be fitted if required, and other fire safety intervention equipment is also issued with the aim of reducing the overall risk from fire.

This is a **FREE** Service available to all high risk or vulnerable residents that are currently being dealt with by the Be Independent Telephone service.
