



Research underpins the College's approach in developing your investigative skills and enhances your analytical processes, thus enabling you to become successful in handling complex information and prepares you for higher level decision making and reasoning in the future.

The College is grouped into six major research clusters: Animal Science, Ecology and Conservation, Rural Business Research Unit, Farm Trials, Horticulture and Plant Science.

## Commercial Trials

To allow students to experience how industry uses research, the College utilises its specialist facilities to run land-based trials on behalf of various commercial operations, examples of recent projects include: maize trials with Grain Seed Ltd and KWS, oil seed rape treatment trials with the Spanish firm Modesto, crop trials with Agrovista and herbicide trials with DOW AgroSiences.


## Student Projects

Below are examples of current research

undertaken by students at Askham Bryan College:

- Assessing peatland restoration: Testate amoebae as a biomonitoring tool.
- Investigating whether captive Grey Reef Sharks follow similar vertical depth patterns and gliding behaviours in comparison to Grey Roof Sharks in the wild.
- Comparison of the potential effect of straight block co-polymer products on soil nutrient leaching.
- The use of equine assisted therapy within riding schools as a viable means to increase participation in equestrianism.
- Effects of flow control, drip recovery and nutrient film technique (N.F.T) hydroponics systems on Vicia faba (broad bean) yields.


## City Life

We recognise that sport is a very important way for students to stay fit and healthy and is a perfect way to unwind from studying. The College provides a calendar of regular fixtures and the opportunity to compete and represent the College in a broad variety of sports.

There are many activities arranged by the Student Experience Co-ordinator, for example you may choose to get involved with our Clubs and Societies, including the Film Society, Debating Society, RAGSoc: A charity and fundraising society, LGBT Society and International Society. The Student Union are always on hand to listen to new ideas to ensure that you, as a student, can get the best out of College life.

Students may also be interested in applying crucial employability, leadership and team working skills by becoming an elected course representative, or part of the College's Student Council, or a Students' Union Officer and possibly consider running for President or Vice President of the Student Union.

## Our Campus Your Facilities

Askham Bryan College is a specialist land-based college with a growing reputation regionally, nationally and internationally. We use our vast estate as a platform for experiential and applied learning.





## Animal Management, Wildlife and Conservation Centre

Inside the main building you can walk through an evolutionary trail exhibiting a variety of species across a range of habitats including aquatics, amphibians, reptiles and mammals. Set in a wildlife and conservation-themed environment are a range of enclosures housing a variety of mammals, birds and hoof stock. The new Centre also boasts a new kennel, cattery, grooming and companion animal wing, complete with training facilities.

### Catering

At Askham Bryan College we have a Refectory and Deli Bar which is open for the use of staff and students daily.

Students who are living in College accommodation on a half-board basis will have a combined ID and food card which will automatically be loaded with their food allowance each week. This can be used by students to purchase their food on campus from the Refectory or Deli Bar. Students electing to stay in the self-catering accommodation have access to a shared kitchen area for the preparation and consumption of meals.



## **Equestrian Centre**

The Equestrian Centre has an indoor arena measuring  $60m \times 30m$  along with an outdoor school measuring  $60m \times 25m$ . In addition to three indoor yards, stabling and support for up to 50 horses. There is also a cross country training area, including various jumps, and horses suitable for riders of all levels including speciality sports horses.

## Farming Estate

The College estate comprises of three farms: Westfield Farm, Home Farm and Headley Hall Farm.

Westfield Farm (185 Hectares) includes 250 milking herd, 250 breeding ewes plus a rotation of winter wheat, spring barley, grass, potatoes and maize.

Home Farm (132 Hectares), situated opposite the College and easily accessed, comprises of Grade 2 arable land cultivating potatoes, wheat and oilseed rape. The land also provides a mix of wetland and woodland habitats for research purposes and activities across the wider curriculum.

Headley Hall Farm (230 Hectares), situated just outside the town of Tadcaster, is a short distance from Askham Bryan College. Soil types at Headley Hall are very different to that at Askham Bryan College, being essentially a 'thin' soil over a bed of limestone. The land is an arable holding, but it also provides grazing for heifers and sheep along with the production of hay or haylage.

## Horticultural Grounds

The College campus is fully planted with beautiful floral displays, plants and landscape features. There are fantastic facilities available to our horticulture students with a broad range of areas used for teaching including complex glass houses, arboretums, display houses, numerous sports surfaces, fully equipped design studios and science labs.





# Facilities continued

## Learning Resources Centre

The Learning Resources Centre (LRC) offers support to students with a team of friendly and professional staff. There are an extensive and growing range of print and e-resources to meet the needs of the higher education curriculum. The facilities include: a reference and lending library; a periodicals collection; a Careers Information Room; DVDs; a soft seating area with daily newspapers; current periodicals and fiction books. The LRC offers extensive computer facilities and copying equipment and wireless access throughout the building.

The first floor of the LRC has been designated a quiet study area for Higher Education students. This includes thirty one computers and an additional printer/copier. The LRC offers extensive opening hours and remains open throughout the holidays.

## Residential Accommodation

We have a range of accommodation available from self-catering and half-board options to managed accommodation across the City of York. For more details on accommodation please see page 24 or visit www.askham-bryan.ac.uk/accommodation

## Science Centre

The Science Centre supports all areas of the curriculum, working closely with students to ensure that they can gain scientific knowledge

and practical skills to support their degree programme.

The Science Centre encompasses specialist laboratories, such as Microbiology and Micropropagation, allowing students to undertake research within a dedicated environment. Specialised equipment is available for students, such as feed nutrition instrumentation, allowing the analysis for protein, fat, calories and fibre content.

## Sports

No matter what your fitness goals are there is something for everyone and our Sports staff are on hand to offer advice and guidance. The facilities include a recently refurbished gym, which includes a functional movement area, cardiovascular machines, strength and conditioning equipment and a TRX system. For those who enjoy team sports, we have a multi-purpose hall which can accommodate basketball or badminton, or allow you to enjoy winter 5-a-side. The campus also offers a number of sports clubs available to all students, including Rugby, Football, Netball, Outdoor Pursuits, Climbing Wall and Martial Arts. For the more serious trainer there is a daily fitness session which runs in the gym each morning.

# Accommodation Home From Home

Awarded 'OUTSTANDING' in the College's Ofsted Care Standards Inspection 2013 and set within our superbly landscaped grounds, the College offers a range of on-site accommodation options.

## Outstanding

The York campus consists of ensuite accommodation in a modern 63 room block. This is offered on a half-board basis, with kitchens to make snacks and hot drinks, but you will need to purchase your meals in the Canteen using a pre-loaded food card.

Within the Main College Building we have rooms with shared bathroom facilities, all refurbished within the last three years. Forty of the rooms are offered on a half-board basis and have fully equipped kitchens to enable you to make snacks and hot drinks. Twenty of the rooms are offered on a self-catering basis with fully equipped kitchens for a more independent living experience.

Bursaries and scholarships are available to students who may need financial assistance in order to help meet accommodation costs.

Living on the doorstep of the City of York allows you to explore and indulge yourself in everything this famous city has to offer. We understand that students may want to live off campus, especially beyond their first year of study.

For students who wish to have a more autonomous experience, the College manages shared houses in and around the centre of York. Students living in managed accommodation also have the benefit of accessing the College transport scheme for easy access to and from the campus each day.

For those wishing to live off campus in a privately rented property, there is help and guidance available from College staff in relation to finding a property and if you have any issues once you are renting a property they will offer help and assistance where they can.





These programmes include an introductory year with study modules plus a work experience element to help you develop strong vocational and general academic study skills alongside specialist knowledge. This introductory year (described below) is followed by Year 1 and Year 2 of the associated Foundation Degree.

In Year 1, all Extended Foundation Degree programmes include the following modules:

- Independent Project
- Work-Based Learning
- Preparatory Academic Skills
- ICT
- Introduction to Biological Science
- Introduction to Laboratory Skills

In addition to the above, each extended programme will carry additional Year 1 modules linked specifically to the specialised area of study as highlighted in below table.

## Entry Requirements:

- Potentially no formal qualifications are required, however, applicants ideally should have achieved a level 2 standard of education in the form of 5 GCSEs, or equivalent, at grade C or above to include English, Maths and Science. Consideration is also given to applicants who have significant industry experience, but have no formal qualifications. Applications from mature candidates are welcomed.

# Applying for Higher Education

Degree level study is normally for those who have completed Level 3 qualifications such as A-levels or a National/Extended Diploma.

Degree programmes can also be accessed by mature students with significant life or work experience.

Foundation Degree Programmes can be 'topped up' to an honours degree with one further year of study.

## **Full Time Study**

## **Extended Foundation Degrees**

Applicants would normally have achieved GCSE grade C or above in English and Maths or equivalent and/or have significant life or work experience. An initial assessment process may be used to inform the College of your current status.

## Foundation Degrees and HNC/HND\*

48 UCAS points plus 5 GCSEs including English, Maths and Science at grade C or above or equivalent.

For entry requirements to the Foundation Degrees in Veterinary Nursing or Veterinary Health Studies see from page 67 onwards.

## BSc/BSc (Hons)\*

84 UCAS points plus 5 GCSEs including English, Maths and Science at grade C or above or equivalent.

## BSc (Hons) Top Up\*

Merit or above in a Foundation Degree (FdSc) or a HND in an appropriate subject.

## BSc (Ord) Top Up\*

Pass or above in a Foundation Degree (FdSc) or a HND in an appropriate subject.

We welcome external applications with advanced standing and accreditation of prior learning (APEL) which will be discussed upon application.

Entry to all undergraduate programmes have an expectation of 5 GCSEs at C or above in English, Maths and Science. Acceptable alternatives are welcome and applicants without formal qualifications can undertake an initial assessment process.

Prospective students will be invited to an applicant day, some students may also be called for an interview.







# Fees and Finance For 2017/18

## **Higher Education Programmes**

Tuition fees for UK/EU students are £8,000 per year for full time courses.

Part time Foundation Degrees are £4,000 per year for four years.

Part time BSc Ordinary, Honours or Top Up routes are £4,000 per year for two years.

Full time HNC/HND is £6,500 per year.

You are responsible for paying your tuition fees, however you may be able to take out a 'Tuition Fee Loan' from the Student Loan Company to cover your fees. You will only start repaying this loan once you have left and you are earning over £21,000 a year.

If you take out a tuition fee loan it will be paid directly to Askham Bryan College on your behalf.

## International Student Fees

Tuition fees for an international student on a full time programme are £9,500 per year. A significant deposit is required in advance of induction and proof of ability to pay.

## What Support Can I Get?

A Student Maintenance Loan is available to help cover accommodation and living costs. (Students must take out the full tuition fee loan to be eligible for maintenance loans). Students undertaking a year in placement may not be eligible for a full maintenance loan.

Students studying higher education programmes are eligible to apply for a maintenance loan to help support them through their studies. We encourage all applicants to apply early through the application process. More information is available through the links below.

Students with specific circumstances may be eligible for extra support, for example, students with children or adult dependants, or a disability or a specific learning difficulty.


