Many in my generation know about the Lucy Maud Montgomery's stories about Anne of Green Gables through the Canadian Broadcasting Company series in the mid-1980s, which was then carried on PBS Wonderworks. Donna of course read all the books! Whether in the pages of the books or on the screen, many of us fell in love with red-headed orphan girl as she tripped and stumbled through life.

Lucy Maud Montgomery as you may know wrote many other books among them the Emily trilogy. There is a quote from "Emily of New Moon" which has come to be a wonderful description for me of the almost magical, no, mystical beauty of the autumn season we are entering. It also expresses the many ways in which I've experienced the holiness that surrounds us every moment, yet often just beyond sight or our ability to empirically know. I share it with you as perhaps a meditation to carry with you this fall. Maybe it will be something you reflect upon when you see the first hint of color in the maples, a wisp of fog lifting off an autumn valley, or when you see the first snowfall on the high peaks.

"It had always seemed to Emily, ever since she could remember that she was very, very near to a world of wonderful beauty. Between it and herself hung only a thin curtain; she could never draw the curtain aside-- but sometimes, just for a moment, a wind fluttered it and then it was as if she caught a glimpse of the enchanting realm beyond-- only a glimpse-- and heard a note of unearthly music."

May you be blessed with glimpses of the beauty that surrounds you and the music that can only be heard in the quiet whispers when the veil is for a moment whisked aside by a fall wind.

Proposal: Conversion to Natural Gas Congregational Church of Laconia (2019)

Rationale

Volatile oil market

Over \$20,000 in oil spent each year in 2017 and 2018

Furnace repairs cost the Church about \$5000 last year

Significant savings in natural gas (as much as \$4000/year)

Scope of the Proposed Work

Eckhardt and Johnson, Mechanical Contractors out of Hooksett, NH

Project: Install new gas burners to both oil boilers complete with new gas line. \$24,700.00

Other options were more costly

OPTION #2) Install one new gas fired boiler for the Rectory as described above.......\$40,162.00

OPTION # 3) Install one new gas fired boiler for the church as described above......\$46,334.00

OPTION #4) To install 2 lead lag boilers in the church. This would be about 45% to 50% more than the single boiler

Quote from Rowell's was over \$100,000

Future considerations: We can get more use out of our boilers, limit the cost of the project, start saving money, and buy time

Financing: Bank of NH

10 year loan for the entire cost of the project

5 percent interest

A \$4000 donation that we received could be to offset the loan amount

September 8 - Congregation votes on the Proposal.


