PROPERTY DAMAGED IN STORM

If Central Oregon's recent storms have caused significant damage to your home or business, you may be eligible for a discount on your property taxes.

Oregon law includes a provision that allows property owners who experience a casualty loss due to an "act of God" or fire to apply for a reduction of property taxes. The proration of tax applies only to taxable structures or property – but not to items such as vehicles or residential personal items.

"We know that the accumulation of snow during our recent storms is starting to cause structural issues and other damage for some property owners in Deschutes County," said Deschutes County Assessor Scot Langton. "It's important that property owners who have been significantly impacted by this winter's storms know about this option.'

Applications are also available at the Deschutes County Tax Office, which is located at 1300 NW Wall Street in Bend. Residents with questions about the application for property tax proration can call the Deschutes County Tax Office at 388-6540.

Applications need to be submitted by June 30.



CENTRAL OREGON CAT ALLIANCE RECEIVES \$21K GRANT FROM PETSMART CHARITIES

The Central Oregon Cat Alliance, a partnership between Bend Spay+Neuter Project, Brightside Animal Center and the Humane Society of Central Oregon, has received a \$21K grant from PetSmart Charities to provide free spay/neuter and vaccinations for 1.000 outdoor cats in Deschutes County in 2017.

High volume, high quality sterilization clinics will be held once a month at either Bend Spay+Neuter Project or the Humane Society of Central Oregon beginning in February. Volunteers are needed to help humanely



trap and transport cats for surgery and vaccinations. Please contact Bend Spay+Neuter Project if you are interested in volunteering, or if you see cats on your property. A full

This program is meant for outdoor, stray or feral cats only and does not apply to pet cats. If you are in need of assistance with spaying/neutering or vaccinating pet cats, please call 541-617-1010.

The Central Oregon Cat Alliance (COCA) has been partnering to address outdoor cat overpopulation and homelessness since 2013. Over the past three years, COCA

has provided spay/neuter and vaccinations for over 3,000 outdoor cats in Deschutes County, dramatically reducing the number of cats entering local shelters and living outdoors. In addition, over 400 kittens have been fostered and adopted into loving homes through this program.





EXCLUSION DAY FOR UNIMMUNIZED CHILDREN WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 15, 2017

Deschutes County Health Services wants to remind parents that children will not be able to attend school or child care starting Feb. 15 if their school records show missing immunizations. State law requires that all children in public and private schools, preschools, Head Start, and certified child care facilities have up-to-date immunization records, or have a non-medical or medical exemption on file at their school.

"The goal of this law is to ensure that all children in our community are protected against serious vaccine-preventable diseases," said Deschutes County Health Services Director Dr. George Conway.

Letters have been sent to notify parents and guardians if their child needs immunizations to stay in school or chiid care. Many parents get letters because their chiid's school or day care records are not up-to-date, even though the child may have all of their shots. It is important for parents to update their child's immunization record after every shot. If school and child care immunization records are not up-to-date, the child will be sent home on Feb. 15.

For parents seeking a non-medical exemption, a certificate of completion of vaccine education from a health care practitioner or from the Oregon Health Authority on-line education module must be provided to the child's school. The module can be viewed at: www.healthoregon.org/vaccineexemption.

Parents seeking immunizations for their children should contact their health care provider, a School Based Health Center (SBHC) or Deschutes County Health Services (541-322-7499) to make an appointment. Appointments at School Based Health Centers can be

COUNTY REMINDS PROPERTY OWNERS TO KEEP SIDEWALKS CLEAR OF SNOW AND ICE

As winter arrives in Central Oregon, the Deschutes County Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) reminds property owners to keep sidewalks clear of snow and ice. Bend, La Pine, Redmond, and Sisters all have ordinances relating to the year-round clearing of sidewalks. While the language varies, the message is the same – business or property owners must remove ice or snow from the sidewalk adjoining their property within a defined time to keep pedestrian walkways clear. Generally, in business districts, the time limit is six hours and in residential areas it is 24 hours.

These city codes help make sidewalks safer and encourage good business practices. When pathways are clear, the message to customers is that the business cares about safety and welcomes access for all to the front door.

The BPAC is an advisory committee of the Deschutes County Commission that seeks to improve conditions for bicyclists and pedestrians throughout Deschutes County. Each year, BPAC recognizes businesses and residents that go above and beyond their legal obligations to keep sidewalks free of snow and ice with Safe Sidewalk awards.

Walking into the well-stocked storeroom, you will notice several volunteers working daily to pull items from the shelves and the coolers to fill those food boxes. They sort, stock and handle the daily traffic that stops by Mondays through Thursdays to get help. Jamie and her crew work tirelessly to keep the products needed

to help people coming through the back door so it can go out the front door!

The Social Services location is continuing a tradition of helping local families since the mid-1980s.



When asked about current needs, Manager, Jamie Smith, explained that working to keep the food on the shelf is only one of their many priorities. "We have the retail sales at SVDP on Huntington to support us in much of what we do. We do need donations of clothing, household items and cash to get by through these really cold months."

Helping folks is always a guessing game. No one can ever predict need accurately and Jamie does her best to be sure that her volunteers have enough to cover the needs of those who apply for food boxes and emergency services. There is always a need for hygiene items, dog and cat food, women's sanitary supplies and baby food/diapers. These are for the emergency applicants who can pick up the items they need to get through a few days. SVDP also works with hoteliers to provide emergency housing. They also contract for emergency dental services with the dental van.

There are several local businesses supporting SVDP. The nonprofit depends on your help. If you are a business who can sponsor SVDP, please give them a call. They can always use more volunteers. FUNDING AVAILABLE TO HELP LA PINE AREA WOODLAND OWNERS

Reduce wildfire risk, improve forest health Apply for financial assistance with NRCS by February 17, 2017.

Private woodland owners in the La Pine watershed can reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire on their land with conservation assistance now available from the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS)

NRCS is teaming up with multiple Central Oregon agencies and groups to provide muchneeded restoration on public and private forests in the greater La Pine area.

This year NRCS is offering \$500,000 to help private woodland owners in the greater La Pine area reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire and improve forest health on their property. Interested landowners should submit applications by February 17 to the NRCS office in Redmond (625 SE Salmon Avenue, Suite 4) to be considered for the current round of

The funding will help woodland owners perform conservation practices like pre-commercial thinning, slash treatment, and fuel breaks. These practices reduce the amount of "fuels" (such as dense, overstocked trees, shrubs and invasive plants) that cause a wildfire to spread higher into the canopy where it causes the most damage. A properly thinned forest holds wildfire lower to the ground, allowing safer access for firefighters to quench

Thinning also helps reduce the spread of insects and disease that impact marketable timber growth and improves wildlife habitat by providing opened spaces for elk, deer and other species.

NRCS is offering the financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)—a voluntary Farm Bill program that reimburses landowners for a portion of the cost to implement conservation practices on private agricultural lands, including woodlands and forests.


This forest restoration effort—called the Greater La Pine Basin Cohesive Strategy Project—began last year and is funded by the Joint Chiefs Landscape Restoration Initiative. The Joint Chiefs initiative is a partnership between two USDA agencies—NRCS and the Forest Service—that reduces wildfire risk on both public and private forests. NRCS is offering assistance to help private landowners treat their woods and forests; and the Forest Service will be performing similar restoration on the federal side of the project boundary in the Deschutes National Forest.

The La Pine project will take place over three years, targeting restoration on nearly 345,000 acres of forestlands—which includes state, federal and private lands in southern Deschutes County and northern Klamath County.


"By doing this proactive forest restoration work across the public and private boundaries, we can create a more fire-adapted community while also significantly enhancing the health and productivity of our precious forests," said Tom Bennett, NRCS district conservationist

In addition to the NRCS funding, other project partners are offering assistance to woodland owners to help them protect their forests. The Oregon Department of Forestry and Walker Range Fire Protection District have funds available to help landowners within the Greater La Pine Area. Smaller, more residential woodland owners in Deschutes County may get assistance through Project Wildfire; and Oregon State University Extension Service offers advice and tips on how to best manage forests and woodlands.

Winter travel can be tough on car and driver, to prepare:

- Check your tires and make sure your chains fit before the first winter storm and check tire pressure during cold weather. Remember, tire shops and mechanics are busiest just before and during winter storms
- Get a vehicle winter maintenance check-up. Don't wait to check your battery, belts, hoses, radiator, lights, bakes, heater/defroster and wipers
- Keep your fuel tank full don't let it fall below half a tank on winter trips
- Program your radio for traffic reports and emergency messages

What to carry on winter trips: • Keep a basic winter survival kit in your vehicle: flashlight, batteries, blanket, snacks, water, gloves, boots, first-aid kit. • Load your car with winter travel gear: tire chains, ice scraper/snow brush, jumper cables, road flares

DESCHUTES COUNTY SELECTED FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PILOT PROGRAM

Deschutes County has been selected to participate in a two-year federally-funded behavioral health pilot program. The new Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) program is designed to increase coordination of care and other treatment services for individuals with the most serious, complex mental illnesses and addictions.

The additional funding will enable the Deschutes County Health Services Department to expand behavioral health services provided to veterans, seniors who are enrolled in Medicare, and other underserved groups. It will also allow for increased collaboration with agencies serving veterans.

Oregon is one of eight states that were selected for the pilot program, which is part of a two-year \$1.1 billion federal investment in mental health and addiction treatment at the community level. Deschutes County is one of 13 Oregon counties that will be participating in the pilot program.

"This is an exciting opportunity for us to increase our ability to address the needs of our most vulnerable citizens," said Deschutes County Commissioner Tammy Baney. "It's an opportunity that doesn't come along every day and a commitment that we don't take lightly.'

To adequately staff the CČBHC program, Deschutes County will hire 29 limited duration employees. New staff members will be hired on a temporary basis and include counselors, case managers, and peer support specialists.

The initial wave of recruiting to staff the pilot program begins this week. Interested applicants can view available openings at www.deschutes.org/jobs. Deschutes County anticipates that the CCBHC pilot program will begin work in April. Additional job openings will be posted in the coming weeks.

"Deschutes County Health Services has a long-standing community-based service model," said Deschutes County Health Services Director Dr. George Conway. "This project provides our community with an excellent opportunity to extend services to additional persons in need. It will also improve coordination of care with our community partners and primary care providers."
