Royal Visitor Praises Work of Local Centre for Homeless

HRH the Duke of Kent spent time at the Welcome Centre on Tuesday 21 February as part of a visit to Redbridge.

Phil Herbert, Director of Healthy Living Projects, commented that "Sonia and I had the pleasure of showing the Duke around the Welcome Centre where he was introduced to staff, volunteers and service users. His Royal Highness took great interest in the stories and experiences that people had to share, and congratulated Healthy Living Project on its hard work and achievements."

The Welcome Centre previously won the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service in 2013. The centre is the first port of call for many rough sleepers in the Borough and sees up to 50 people daily. Clients are given a health check by on-site staff.

Eco Volunteers help Vine Church at Eco Action Day

On Saturday 4 February, Vine Church hosted an Eco Action Day at their Holstock Road Community Halls. Over 40 volunteers from all sections of the Ilford community, most with no church connections, came along to help.

In the morning, volunteers with no specific previous experience learned how to carry out simple DIY jobs aimed at making the buildings more energy efficiency. Jobs included:

- fitting loft insulation in the community house
- putting aluminium reflector panels behind outside wall radiators
- replacing old incandescent light bulbs with new energy efficient LED bulbs
- lagging the pipes from the gas boilers
- putting temporary secondary glazing on an outside door to prevent heat loss
- insulating doors to prevent draughts
- sorting out the compost bins in the garden and putting mulch on the beds
- planting an apple tree
- repairing a broken gutter in the garden

Guests and volunteers enjoyed a lunch of vegetarian soup, prepared by volunteers from Transition Ilford and Vine Church. During the lunch hour, participants sang songs about care for the environment, led by Redbridge Music Lounge.

The Mayor of Redbridge and MP Mike Gapes were present to help to emphasise the importance of the issue of climate change. Green hearts were distributed to mark the beginning of the national For the Love Of campaign. This campaign is an annual celebration of all that we love but could lose to climate change.

Mike Gapes MP in his comments referred to the petitions that hundreds of local Ilford people had sent him in November to

encourage the government to ratify the Paris Climate Change agreements.

The event was organised by Vine United Reformed Church who look after extensive but old buildings in Central Ilford. It was supported with the help of Amey, Redbridge Recycling team, Redbridge Faith Forum, Volunteer Centre Redbridge, Transition Ilford, Sophia Hubs and Awaaz.

City Bridge Trust gave the grant for the initial Eco Audit carried out by 3 Acorns to look at how community organisations can care better for their buildings.

As the Mayor Cllr Bhamra emphasised in his speech, "Here in Ilford we are showing how we care for our community buildings and how we can make them more energy efficient. Like all faith communities the Vine United Reformed Church tries to be a welcoming place. It welcomes eighteen user groups. Over 500 people visit the premises each week and the buildings are used daily. But like all old buildings it was built by different generations, in a different era when there was different awareness of the role fossil fuels played in destroying our climate."

Policies and Procedures: What Do You Need?

Policies and procedures provide guidelines on how people in your organisation should work. They are crucial to acting consistently, professionally and transparently – to being an effective organisation. This session is particularly meant for new groups.

Safeguarding Adults, level 1

All employees and volunteers who come into contact with service users in their work have a duty of care to safeguard and promote their welfare.

The vast majority of people who work with service users aim to provide a safe, supportive environment. However, tensions and misunderstandings sometimes occur and can give rise to allegations of abuse, which are inevitably distressing and difficult for all concerned. Equally, some allegations will be genuine, and some people deliberately seek out, create or exploit opportunities to abuse service users. It is essential that all possible steps are taken to safeguard service users, and to ensure that individuals working with them are safe to do so.

A new campaign is making clear that anyone can register with a GP – you don't need to have a fixed address or identification, and your immigration status does not matter.

Healthy London Partnership have produced a card which homeless people can take to a GP when registering, which explains their rights.

Funding Diary

Youth social action

Step Up to Serve, the Lottery and DCMS support young people taking practical action in the service of others to create positive social change that benefits the wider community as well as the young person themselves. Young people are defined as those aged 10 to 20, and up to 25 for disabled young people. Funding available for activities including campaigning, fundraising and volunteering.

Closing date: Monday 6 March

Redbridge Community Project and Small Grants Fund

Support from Redbridge Council for voluntary organisations to deliver services through community initiatives. Applications must align with Council priorities. Community Project Fund awards of £5,000 to £25,000 are available to address the recommendations of the Fairness Commission. Small grants of less than £5,000 are also available.

Closing date: Monday 6 March

Tackling fuel poverty

Grants of up to £50,000 for charities providing advice on energy efficiency, taking practical measures for energy efficiency or providing benefits advice. Applications for work with children and family especially welcome.

Closing date: Wednesday 8 March

Using sport to empower women and girls

Organisations working in partnership can apply for grants of between £30,000 and £250,000, over a period of between 12 and 36

months. The partnership must include a track record of working with women and girls, and using sport as a tool for change.

Closing date: Thursday 16 March

Homelessness, refugees, young people, penal affairs

Hilden Charitable Fund makes grants to projects that address disadvantage and by supporting causes which are less popular. In particular, the Fund wants to support projects that:

- Address homelessness
- Supports asylum seekers and refugees
- Support community based initiatives for disadvantaged young people 16 – 25
- Penal affairs

The average grant awarded is £5,000 and preference is given to supporting small community organisations with an income of less than £500,000 per year. The Trust will consider funding project as well as core running costs of organisations.

Closing date: Thursday 16 March

Funding for work with victims of crime

The aim of the Fund is to maximise the potential of voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations to help ensure the continued and improved provision of vital services to support victims of crime and help them cope and recover. A portion of the fund will be ring-fenced for both hate crime victims and victims of violent crime.

Grants of between £10,000 and £35,000 are available. Partnerships of three or more organisations applying together can apply for up to £100,000.
