Report of the Trustees

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2013

During the year the Cable & Wireless Worldwide Group, the Foundation's primary sponsor, was acquired by Vodafone Group plc. As a result, the Trustees considered that the Foundations aims would be better served through the Vodafone Foundation and have decided that the Cable & Wireless Worldwide Foundation will be wound up. The winding up of the Foundation is expected to be completed through a members' voluntary liquidation during the forthcoming year.

Incorporation

Cable & Wireless Worldwide Foundation (the Foundation) was incorporated on 15 June 2011 as a charitable company, limited by guarantee

Principal funding sources

The Foundation derived most of its funding through an annual cash donation from the Cable & Wireless Worldwide Group Further cash funding has been received through third party donations

Reserves policy

All reserves are deemed general, unrestricted reserves for the furtherance of the Foundation's objectives. The Foundation expects to distribute all donations received to charitable partners taking reasonable measures to ensure sufficient funds are available to satisfy all obligations as they fall due, a specific reserves policy has not been defined.

Public benefit

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty contained in the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to public benefit in determining the activities undertaken by the Foundation Further, the Trustees have given consideration to the guidance on public benefit, published by the Charities Commission, in exercising their powers and duties, when setting the Foundation's aims and objectives and when planning its activities

Financial review, achievement and performance

During the year, the Trustees agreed to make one-off donations to a greater number of charitable causes, supporting the Foundation's aims, but each of lower monetary value than in the prior period. The Foundation also satisfied all of its remaining commitments to provide funding to Whizz-Kidz, Communication for Blind and Disabled People and Christel House.

The results for the year are set out on page 6 All activities are undertaken from the general fund (an unrestricted fund)

With creditors satisfied and having distributed the Foundation's remaining funds to appropriate charitable causes, the activities of the Foundation have ceased. The Directors now intend to wind up the Foundation through a members' voluntary liquidation.

Statement of Trustees responsibilities

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to

- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures
 disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue its activities

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the charitable company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the financial statements

1. Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities, the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)

The financial statements have been prepared on the cessation basis

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Income and expenditure account when the Foundation becomes, with reasonable certainty, entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Services donated by Cable & Wireless Worldwide Group companies may include providing seconded staff and other management and administrative services. Staff time is recognised as income when the service or resource is provided to beneficiaries of charitable activities with an equivalent amount being included as resources expended. The value of staff time is calculated based on actual hours provided multiplied by an average staff cost.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a grant is committed and liability is incurred. A cash grant is recognised as payable in the following circumstances

- where no fulfilment condition is attached to a grant, it is recognised in full at the date of commitment to the recipient
- where a fulfilment condition is attached to a grant, the amount recognised in the financial statements is the greater of the amount paid or the amount due on fulfilment by the recipient at the balance sheet date
- where the amount recognised is the amount fulfilled, this is calculated on the basis of time, unless specified otherwise in the grant agreement

An authorised cash pledge will be accrued in the balance sheet, the accrual will be extinguished when the cash disbursement is made

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in the furtherance of the general objectives of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds

Cash flow statement

Under FRS1, the Foundation is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company

Taxation

The Foundation is considered to pass the tests set out in Paragraph 1 Schedule 6 Finance Act 2010 and therefore meets the definition of a charitable company for UK corporation tax purposes. Accordingly, the charity is potentially exempt from taxation in respect of income or capital gains received within categories covered by Chapter 3 Part 11 Corporation Tax Act 2010 or Section 256 of the Taxation of Chargeable Gains Act 1992, to the extent that such income or gains are applied exclusively to charitable purposes
